TROOPS FACE TO FACE.

Russian and Japanese Armies on Opposite Sides of Yalu River. 70,000 Japanese in Corea.

Special to Journal. London, March 25.—The Russians have advanced their fighting line to the Anju river, sixty miles south of the Yalu river, and fighting with the Japanese has begun.

News from Ping Yang, where the Japanese army has been massing for a month, says large forces of the Russian and Japanese troops are face to face on opposite sides of the banks of the Anju river.

A dispatch says 4,500 Cossacks and infantry have crossed the Yalu river in the last five days, 3,000 holding Anju, 1,000 at a strategic point on the Corasan bank of the Yalu, and 500 occupy Chun Ju.

A dispatch from Chefoo says 5,000 additional Japanese troops have landed at Chinsampo, making the total number of Japanese in Corea, 95,000 men.

The report that the Japanese have bottled up the Russian Port Arthur fleet is doubted. Experts say it could not be done so easily.

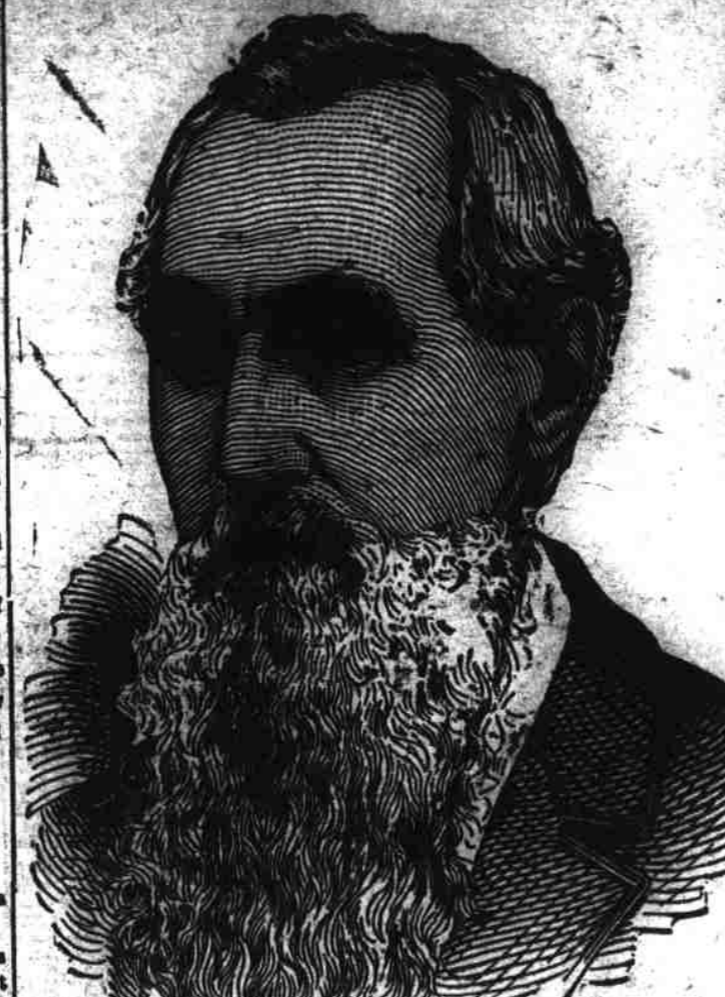
