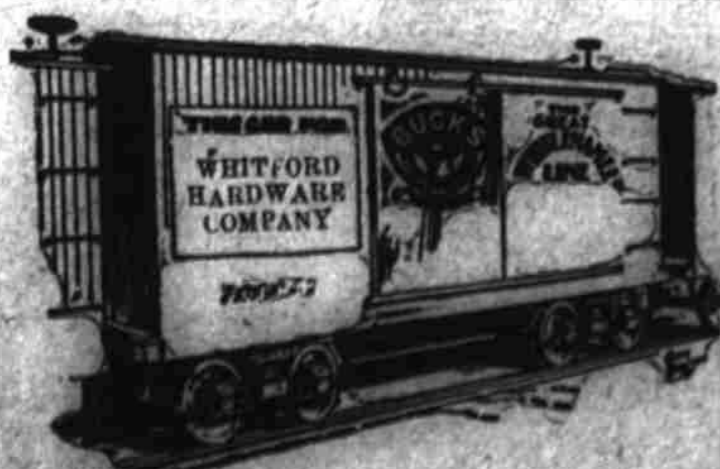

CHALLENGE NEUTRAL POWERS

By Russia. Marital Law Declared in Manchuria. American and British Consuls Forced to Leave.

Special to Journal.
London, Feb. 28.—Under an order from Vladimir Alexieff, declaring New Chang, Manchuria in a state of war and under martial law, the American and British flags were today removed from the property of American and British citizens.

Alexieff's order says the Newchang dispatch is regarded as a challenge to the neutral powers as it excludes them from trade in this port. The civil administration had agreed with the foreign consuls to suspend the right enforcement of this order until the American and other governments could act.

At a meeting with the consuls today, the administration informed them that it was Russia's intention, besides declaring martial law, to annul all consular jurisdiction. A dispatch today says the latest attack, followed the battle of yesterday accompanying the attempt to bottle up Port Arthur, was successful. So say Japanese reports.

BILL FOR CONSPIRACY.

Drawn Against Mebee and Finch. Committee to Examine A. & N. C. Affairs.

Raleigh, March 28.—Solicitor Armistead Jones of this district, is drawing a bill which he will send to the Grand Jury in the criminal court here, tomorrow, in the case of the State against Mebee and Finch in the charge of conspiracy. The court met today. It is not known whether the case will be taken up at this term, if the grand jury returns a true bill, or whether the lawyers will have it carried over until the next term.

It is expected that tomorrow the Governor will name the three men, who are to co-operate with the State board of internal improvements, in making an extremely thorough inspection of the Atlantic and North Carolina Railway. They will be well known business men and may be given authority to employ an expert accountant to go over the books and papers. This inspection would have been made, whether the receivership matter had ever come up or not. The Governor so stated today.

Pettingill Advertising Agency Falls.

BOSTON, MASS., March 28.—The newspaper advertising agency of Pettingill and company today announced that it had placed its affairs in the hands of its creditors. Counsel representing Pettingill and company stated the liabilities may reach \$1,000,000, with assets possibly one-quarter of that amount. The announcement of the financial troubles of the company was made in a statement issued by counsel, which said the corporation had become badly embarrassed through many errors of judgment in the extension of credits and in the general conduct of its business. Pettingill and company have been doing business in Boston since 1848, and had a wide connection among the newspapers of the country.

Site Accepted in Moore County by King's Daughters.

Union Passenger Depot Question. Fear of Frost. Pains From Smith's Island. Finch Case Not Helped by Alleged Agreement.

Raleigh, Feb. 28.—The King's Daughters have accepted the offer of 80 acres of land in the suburbs of Lake View, Moore county, on which will be erected the reformatory for young white criminals, which work the King's Daughters have adopted, as their state work. The land is the gift of the Lakeview Town-site Company.

The corporation commission left this afternoon for Charlotte, where tomorrow the hearing in the matter of the Union Passenger station will be had. The Southern Railway is leading in the fight against this station and the matter has become of general public interest. The unseasonably cool weather yesterday and today following some very warm days has caused much fear of frost.
