## WHY TREES ARE RUINED.

Lack of Hitching Posts Throughout the City. Horses are Left Before Trees.

New Bern at one time was noted for its beautiful shade trees, but with the wires above, causing constant cutting away, and the unkindly horses below, to nibble and bite away the bark from old and young trees, there is little chance for any continuance of even the present shade trees, much less an opportunity for property owners to cultivate and develop a new growth of shade trees, which shall beautify our streets and lead a grateful and refreshing shade during the Summer days, when shade is so desirable and necessary for comfort.

But aside from the wires which are really so destructive to the shade trees of a city, there is the damage caused by horses which are carelessly left standing, hitched or unhitched, near the trees.

There has been a great deal said about the drivers of city delivery wagons, and drivers of other vehicles leaving their horses near trees, while the drivers go into houses, the result being that horses so left are certain to bite and tear the trees near which they are left.

Probably no driver who has been accused of carelessness in this particular, of letting his horse damage trees, has presented the argument that the tree was the only thing which could be found, by which a horse could be hitched or left standing.

How many hitching posts are there in this city on some of the principal streets? Just to show why trees are ruined, which is largely due to the lack of hitching posts, the Journal has had a count made of the posts now standing, and the number is as follows:

- Pollock street, 15.
  - Broad, 13.
  - New, 1.
  - Johnson, 9.
  - Craven, 6.
  - Graves, 1.
  - Middle, 8.
  - East Front, 3.
  - Metcalf, 7.
  - Hancock, none
  - George to Railroad, none
- It may be that a hitching post placed where such a check was needed for horses, might not be always heeded by drivers, but the chances are that the trees would be given a much greater chance for their lives than they now have, with the above few posts. At least it is up to every property owner, who wishes to have his trees kept from hungry horses and careless drivers, to have a post, which can be used, and which will hold a horse safe from getting at nearby trees, and so giving every property owner the opportunity of having good shade trees around his premises.

Let there be sufficient hitching posts, and then the law can be meted out to offenders who permit their horses to ruin the trees.

It is expected the special investigating committee of the Atlantic & North Carolina Railway will select Thos D Meares as expert accountant.
