BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

April Meeting Ordinances Adopted Official Reports and Petitions.

New Bern N. C. April 8th.

Board Aldermen met in regular session Mayor Ellis, presiding, Aldermen present: Sanger, Smith, Avery, Lane, McSorley, Phillips, Wood, Watson, and McCarthy.

Minutes were read and amended and adopted.

The following petition was read to the Board.

State of North Carolina County of Craven City of New Bern.

To the Hon. Board of Aldermen of the city of New Bern.

The petition of undersigned registered voters of said city who are registered for the last municipal election held therein respectfully request your Honor able body to order an election to be held after 30 days notice in said city to determine the question: Whether bar rooms or saloons shall be established in said city.

Upon motion a committee was appointed to investigate the legality of the call and to report to the Mayor soon as possible. Mayor appointed following committee: McSorley, Watson, and Wood.

Attorney McIver, made statement relative to the cemetery trustee fund and by motion he was instructed and empowered to act in the matter in his judgment to best interest for the city.

Upon motion the light bill was referred back for investigation and correction. By order of board the water and light commission was instructed to change the corner Change street so as to hang in light center of street.

Upon motion the Street and Pump committee was instructed to extend cover up Change street as needed.

The hydrant ordered placed between George and Bern at its prior meeting. Upon motion was left with Street and Pump committee to locate where most needed.

Upon motion the property committee was instructed to have roof of City Hall painted.

Upon motion the matter of drainage near North West corner of Queen and Bern Sts. was left with Street and Pump committee.

Street and Pump committee recommended the purchase of pair mules for city use. Upon motion the matter was left with Street and Pump committee with Mayor and Alderman Smith, added with power to act.

Upon motion the Fleet street extension matter was referred back to committee to get in proper shape and report at next meeting.

By order of Board a voucher for \$100 was ordered issued to attorney McIver for special legal services rendered city.

Upon motion the Street and Pump committee was instructed to place hydrant on Johnson street.

Fews From New Bern.

From Forest and Stream, April 9th 1904.

New Bern, N. C. April 11--Editor Forest and Stream: Who do you suppose I met here one day this week? Give it up? Well, I met Charles Hallock. Yes, it was old Charles Hallock, the man that gave Forest and Stream such a boost that it has never been able to stop its growth since.

I say "old" because, compared with the young fellows eighty odd, he is old. But you'd never imagine he had passed the three-score-and-ten mark, which he has, for his cheeks are so rosy, his eyes are bright, and his step as springy--"hear about," as they say down here, as they were in the eighties when he was living in New Bern and booming it for all he was worth.

It is just possible that your readers may hear from him shortly, for I told him a heap of things that would make good copy.

I have been here for two or three months every winter since 1898, and hope to "do as much more," as the old mate is much sicker than that of New Jersey and living more reasonably, with quiet, snipe, ducks and deer abound in the surrounding woods and marshes.

Thanks to the educational efforts of the Audubon Society in spreading useful information about birds, the white and gray gulls which winter here have, by their numbers and increased numbers, added a great attraction to the water front along the Neuse River. Thoughtless men and boys no longer shoot at them from the river bank, and being molested they fly or swim about quite close to the sea-wall which skirts the promenade and will fearlessly pick up scraps of food thrown to them. This, to strangers, is intensely interesting, and recalls the latest display by visitors to the Charleston Exposition in the docks of wild ducks which found a safe asylum in Cullen's Lake, and along the water front of the famous South Battery.

Fishing for black bass, whose local name is Whitefish, is good now and not long better every day.

But five left and sports are said to find the fish run to weight from two to six pounds. Later in the season other kinds of fish are taken in large numbers, but the Whitefish is the only game fish, strictly speaking, that is found in the vicinity.

Selected For Democratic Conventions Third Congressional District.

Goldsboro, April 12--The Executive Committee of the Third Congressional District met here today, as per official call.

The committee met in Hotel Kunnyn at 1 p. m. W. L. Hill, chairman, T. O. Whitaker, secretary. Those present were F. B. Ermi, Craven, W. L. Hill, Duplin, T. O. Whitaker, Jones, A. H. Herring, Sampson, Jos. E. Robinson, Wayne. Pamlico county was represented by E. W. Kerr, while Carteret, Onslow and Pender sent their proxies.

Chairman Hill stated the object of the meeting to be to name a place and date for holding the nominating convention for the Third Congressional District.

E. W. Kerr placed Goldsboro in nomination, which was seconded by J. E. Robinson; On motion, the Secretary cast the vote for Goldsboro. A. H. Herring made motion that Tuesday, June 21st at 1 p. m. be made the date for the convention. This was seconded by T. O. Whitaker, and was adopted by unanimous vote.

On motion, W. M. Hand, of Pender county, was elected to fill out the unexpired term of Mr. Black, deceased, as committeeman from Pender.
