Whereas said city of New Bern and said Atlantic Coast Line Railroad company have agreed to compromise and settle said dispute and put it in the shape of an ordinance of the city.

Splendid St. Louis Route.

Mr. F. W. Card, Passenger Agent of the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway at Norfolk was in the city yesterday, looking after the affairs of his company, especially in the matter of the St. Louis Exposition to which the C. & O. Railway offer particularly attractive service for the people of this section, who will go to the great St. Louis Exposition.

As can be seen by the C. & O. Railway advertising in this paper, this road offers low rates, and the schedules are such as to make the trip advantageous from this city and Eastern Carolina, from Norfolk from which point the Chesapeake and Ohio will have two trains leaving daily, so that travelers can leave Norfolk in the morning or afternoon, and reach St. Louis the following night or the second morning, as may be desired. There will be both day coaches and sleeping cars on all trains.

The Chesapeake and Ohio Railway passes through some of the most beautiful country to be found anywhere, which adds to the attractiveness of this route.

New Idea in Scientific Farming.

The New Bern truck farmers who always up to date and adopt the most advanced methods of truck farming, have had their attention called to this system of irrigation.

Mr. Wm. Dunn, a prominent trucker of this vicinity has introduced this system and has about 7 or 8 acres on his farm covered with the irrigation pipes.

Mr. W. C. Willetts, expects to adopt this system and no doubt others will follow.

The thinnest system of irrigation consists of a system of iron or galvanized pipes 40 feet apart and the length of which can be according to the number of feet of ground to be covered. These are elevated from the ground on stakes set firmly in the ground. The stakes may be made high enough for a horse to pass under if it is considered important to work the crop both ways.

The pipes are perforated and little brass sprays or nozzles are inserted four feet apart in the pipes and when the water is turned on it gives a uniform spray the entire length of the line. In 48 hours of continuous pumping at 50 pounds pressure it can equal 18 inches of rain. The greatest value of this system consists of irrigation in protecting the plants from frost as on frosty nights warm water can be circulated all over the garden at night. By this irrigation ten acres will yield more profit than a large farm now devoted to the old plan.

A LITTLE SKIRMISH

Between Small Bodies of Russians and Japanese.

Tokio, April 13.—An official account of the skirmish between two small bodies of Japanese and Russians on April 10th on the banks of the Yalu reached here today. A Japanese lieutenant and five marines were sent on a Korean fishing boat to reconnoitre about the mouth of the river. They sighted seven Russian cavalrymen on a Chinese junk and attacked them. A sharp exchange of shots followed. The Russians were reinforced, but were driven back and one was killed and two wounded. The Japanese suffered no loss.

(The above report from St. Petersburg sources says the Russians annihilated a whole troop of Japanese cavalry, in this conflict.)

RECORD BREAKING PEACH TREE

Four Peaches From One Bloom. An Unusual Incident. Fruit not Hurt by Frost.

Mr. Jesse Harrison showed the Journal something rare in the line of peach culture yesterday. He brought to the office a small branch from a tree in his yard which was covered with the fruit. A very strange circumstance about this particular tree is that in many cases four peaches spring from the bloom. The tree has borne fruit for six or seven years but not until last year did it give any appearance of breaking the record. Mr. Harrison thought it merely a freak which would not be apt to be repeated but this year the tree has done the same thing again.

The peaches, Mr. Harrison says, do not seem to suffer for size or quality on account of this triple production, but each specimen is large and sweet. He is unable to tell the variety. It has a delicious flavor, good size and is a free stone.

Mr. Harrison thinks that the frost has not injured the fruit, at least this tree gives no sign of being affected by the weather. The promise for a large crop is very encouraging.

RUSSIAN BATTLESHIP SUNK.

Off Fort Arthur By Japanese Torpedo Reports Agree.

London, April 13.—The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Renter Telegram Company wires that a semi-official telegram has been received in the Russian capital stating that the Russian battleship Petropavlovsk was sunk off Fort Arthur in an engagement with the Japanese. Four officers including the Grand Duke Cyril, the czar's cousin, were wounded. All the other were lost. The battleship was torpedoed. He says it is reported two other Russian vessels were seriously damaged.
