SUMMER BOARDERS ATTENTION

The First Whale of the Season Seen on the North Carolina Coast.

From Marion comes the first report of any whale on the coast. The Marion correspondent of the Elizabeth City Record states that a really truly whale has been seen near there by at least one truthful man.

Mr. Joe Tom Daniels, a fisherman was out at sea fishing for starpon when he saw a monster whale coming toward him with wide open mouth and at a very rapid rate.

Daniels put up all the sail the boat could carry and made every possible effort to get out of the way of the whale, even jutting out further to sea. He escaped the monster and waited some time before daring to go back for fear the whale might appear. Mr. Daniels is now safe at Marston and feels mighty glad that he wasn't a Jonah.

Daniels described the whale as 75 feet long as near as he could tell at a hasty glance; that much was out of water and he is not selling how much his whale-ship was towing behind. The man thinks the fish was not less than 100 feet long. The dimensions of the distended mouth was all of 30 feet and could have swallowed the boat, mast, cargo and all and then asked for a second helping.

BIG FIRE AT POLLOCKSVILLE.

Two Large Supply Stores Burned, Two Dwelling Houses Caught but Saved by Hard Work.

Pollockville, April 14.—Last night about 11:00, fire was discovered in a room in the second story of Mr. Charley Whitty's store at this place, which had gotten such headway before its discovery, that it was impossible to control it.

The whole storehouse and contents were soon in a blaze. About \$400 or \$500 worth of goods were saved, in a badly damaged condition. In about 30 minutes, the store of Mr. J. W. Shepard was in a blaze, which was soon in a heap of ashes. He saved about \$500 or \$600 worth of goods.

It was with great difficulty that the dwellings of both Messrs. Whitty and Shepard were saved. Mr. Whitty's house caught several times, but by hard work and great risk of life, it was put out each time.

The origin of the fire is a mystery. It is not thought to be incendiary. There was \$500 insurance on Mr. Whitty's stock of goods, none on the store. His loss is estimated at \$3,500.

Mr. Shepard had \$600 insurance on his store, but none on stock of goods. His loss is estimated at \$3,000.

The people of this place are the best workers in time of fire of any place we ever saw. No well organized fire department ever did better or more effective work than has been done by our people in every case of fire at this place.

Both races work in common at all fires, which is greatly appreciated by us all.

SUNK BY JAPANESE.

Russian Battleship, Vice Admiral Makarov and 750 Men Perished.

Tokio, April 14.—According to a dispatch received from Admiral Uris today the Russian battleship, Petropavlovsk was not sunk by a Russian mine, but by the Japanese. Uris's report says that Admiral Togo's fleet sank the battleship, and one destroyer. There are no Japanese losses.

St. Petersburg, April 14.—The report that Grand Duke Cyril was seriously injured in the disaster at Port Arthur yesterday is confirmed. A definite list of the dead in the destruction of the battleship shows forty one officers and 750 men have lost their lives.
