### Organize Retail Clerks.

Mr. R. P. Dixon of Raleigh was in the city yesterday to interest the retail clerks in the matter of organization. A meeting was held last night for the purpose of forming a union in the room of the New Bern Fire Company. There were about 30 salesmen present, and his talk impressed them with the advantage of such an organization.

The union is a branch of the great American Federation of Labor with its 1,500,000 members and is itself composed of 30,000 members. It is styled the Retail Clerks' International Protective Association and is formed with the joint idea of social, intellectual and material advancement and improvement.
