THE A & N C REPORT,

Expected Next Week, Gessle Says A. C. L. Road Behind Lease Movement. Attorney Gilmer's

Raisigh, N. C. May 4th.—It is expect ed that the report on the Atlantic & North Carolina railway will be made to the governor next week by the board of day made of the fact that another pro to lease this road and that it came from Philadelphia. It was made by some large dealers in bonds in that city. The Releigh & Pamilto Round railway has withdrawn its bid for a lease, thus leaving in the field the Atlantic rallway company, of which W. W. Mills, of Raleigh and others are the stockholders, and the Philadelphia men as the two bidders. There is no end of talk agein about the road, owing to the new effort to get a receiver. One of the questions asked was who was paying the bills of these suits etc. It is said that Cuyler of New York is not doing it, for he owns only 87 shares and the Federal court costs would quickly eat him up and it is said one cannot go into the Federal court for less than \$2000. Not a few people believe that the Atlantic Coast Line is behind the movement for a lease.

It said that this road would prefer to have the present status continue, but it does not wish any one except the State to control the road. The preparation of the case, that is the State's side in the Cuyler matter will begin at once. Ex-governor Jarvis will be here tomorrow and he and James H Pou will assist the attorney general in making the fight against the receivership now asked for by Cuyler. It is said the private stockholders are not joining in the Cuyle: movement. The whole matter is renewed The question is who is pushing the Cuyler suit.

Attorney General Gilmer when asked what would be the attitude of the State in regard to the application for a receiver of the Atlantic and North Carolina Rallway made by John P Cuyler of New York replied that the State will resist to the utmost the appointment of a receiver. He questioned most seriously the power of the Federal court to appoint a receiver of State property. He does not believe there will be an appointment, as he does not think the conditions or circumstances warrant it. The applications for a receiver as made by Cuyler is almost precisely like that which Finch made and falled, on. Pretty much the same fight will be fought over again, the Attorney General says. There are some new figures in the new complaint of Cuyler and these the Attorney General says were no doubt furnished by V.E. McBee, during the brief time while the latter was the receiver of the road


