**The Potato Beetle.**  
 The Entomological Circular No. 9 of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has for its subject the "Potato Beetle" and gives a history of the bug, its characteristics, hibernation, and its record in this State.

This well known pest of potato growers is said to have been first discovered in the Rocky Mountain section, and began its march to the East along about 1860.

The movement of the bug seems to have been rapid for it made its appearance near Charlotte, in this State about 1877, and from there it has established itself in nearly every section of the State.

The Circular gives a history of the insect from its larva state and through the different stages of development to the striped beetle as it is commonly known by the potato grower. The bug increases very rapidly and begins its voyage while still larvae and keeps it up.

After passing through the various stages the adult beetle hides in the ground or under rubbish and remains there during the winter getting ready to begin activities in the spring.

The bug will feed on several other plants but that plant seems to be its favorite diet.

The English Sparrow, and certain ground beetles are the potato bug's natural enemies, but the latter are so numerous that their services do very little toward diminishing them.

The Circular recommends Paris green as the only safe and sure remedy to be used against the bug, but suggests the use of that poison with other ingredients and gives a recipe of what is called "Bordeaux Mixture and Paris green." This mixture is intended to be applied with a good spray pump, but can be used by simpler methods, and should be applied three or four times during the season.

The preparation of the mixture is very simple and unexpensive. The expert in works trying and we publish the formula as given by the Department of Agriculture for the benefit of those who are interested in it.

"Dissolve five pounds blue-stone in four or five gallons of water by hanging in a sack in a bag in which the water is placed, the sack containing the blue-stone being just below the surface. When entirely dissolved, add water to make twenty-gallons; now take five pounds of lime and add water to make twenty-five gallons. Then two solutions the one containing the blue-stone and the other the Paris green, are to be kept separate, and the blue-stone solution must be kept in a wooden receptacle. Whenever it is desired to make an application, take out equal quantities of the two solutions and pour together, stirring thoroughly. This gives the perfect Bordeaux Mixture, to which Paris green is added in the ratio of one ounce to every ten gallons. Mix the green first with a little water in a cup or saucer and then pour it into the Bordeaux. Strain to remove sediment and apply with a spray pump or with water-pot or brush if pump is not to be had. (But you should have a pump; there is no doubt about that.) See Circular No. 4 on that subject."
