CUTLER'S COMPLAINT FOR RE- CEIVER.

Respect Exhibited For Editor Furman
Engineer Byers' Death. Judge
Fletcher Case at Fayetteville.

Raleigh N. C. May 13th.—Thought it was said last night that the State would fit its answer to the Cutler complaint and apply for a writ for the Atlantic & North Carolina railway. I was said this morning that it would not be filed until later a day, but not probably be officially filed until May 14th, the date set by Judge Farnell for the hearing of the matter. The answer is short, only 700 pages, it is said, and contains nothing sensational in the way of new matter. It differs, however, from the answer made to the complaint of Finch. The State has summoned witnesses, but will use affidavits, it is understood. Cutler's side has summoned a number of witnesses.

The State and national flags on the Capitol were at half staff today, as a mark of respect to the memory of ex-State Auditor Robert M. Furman, whose sudden death yesterday so shocked the people of Raleigh and indeed of the whole State. In front of the headquarters of L. O. B. Branch camp, Confederate Veterans, his flag draped in mourning was displayed today, with a notice that the funeral of ex Lt. Furman, company E, 71st regiment, N. C. troops would be held tomorrow morning. A great many tributes have been paid Mr. Furman who for 34 years had been to all known and a greatly esteemed by the people of Raleigh.

Engineer Byers of the Atlantic Coast Line who was killed in an accident near Fayetteville yesterday came to North Carolina in 1900 and became an engineer on the Seaboard Air Line, living at Raleigh where his family now is. He left here only 3 months ago and went on the Atlantic Coast Line.

It is learned from one of the officials of the Raleigh Street railway that it will extend its line to the National Cemetery and the Confederate soldiers home, which are in the extreme eastern part of the city and very near together.

The large party of Robeson county lawyers and their attorneys, who have been here a couple of days preparing their answer to the charge of contempt of Judge Farnell left this afternoon for Fayetteville, where this much talked of matter comes up tomorrow. The majority of the people think the lawyers will win out, but some take the other view.
