RALEIGH.

State Medical Society in Session, ; Ens tern Asylem at Goldsboro Full of Pattents Observation of the Venerable Dr McHufham-

Raleigh May 22rd.—The 51st annua seting of the North Carolina Medical Society began today in the Hall of the House of Common in the Capitol. It was called to order by Dr. Hubert A. Royster, the chairman of the local comnittee. State Auditor B. F. Lixon de livered the address of welcome on behalf Bank vs Holligeworth from Buncombe of the State, Ed Chambers Smith that on two appeals, decided in favor of defen-behalf of Raleigh, Dr. James M. Parrott, of Kinston, responding. Dr. H. B Weaver of Asheville, the president of the society, delivered the annual address. Reports were made by Dr. F. L. Syler of Franklin, Dr. M. L. Stevens of Asheville Dr. Frank Roberts of Marshall, and Dr G. C. Edwards of Green county. The attendance is quite a large, over 200 beng present, besides 91 applicants for

license as physicians. Superintendent J. M. Miller of the hospital for the colored insane at Golds boro says it is entirely full, there being 584 patients, more than three fifths of whom are wemen. During the past week eight applications have been received, six from women. Superintendent James McKee of the hospital for the insane here says there are 311 female patients, filling the 211 beds in that ward with 69 applications on file, while 29 applications have been forwarded to the Western Hospital.
