RALEIGH COOLS OFF

Expressions of Satisfaction on Pritchard's Appointment.

Great Increase in State Charters Negro Killed in Base Ball Quarrel. Educational Campaign for Summer And Fall

Raleigh, June 4.—Judge Pritchard expected to leave here this afternoon for Asheville but decided to go direct to Washington. He said he would go to Asheville about the 8th or 9th of the month. He received a great many callers during his brief stay here. A great many compliments are paid him and people without regard to party express pleasure at his appointment as judge. A no very prominent man remarked that during the past 25 years no man had been luckier than Judge Pritchard and that he deserved every one of the good things which had come to him.

The secretary of State finds that since 1900, when the present administration came in, more charters have been granted than during all the time previous to that date. Up to 1900 the total number was only 1108. The number now is 2225. The secretary is very much gratified at this fine showing.

The chairs and window glass for the Methodist O. phange here have arrived. The trustees met on the 21st and will fix the sum for the dedication of the building, which will not be entirely completed until the heating plant is installed.

The quiet here today after the terrible rush of the week was really delightful. Everybody spoke about it. As attorney B. C. Beckwith remarked everybody felt like a lot of people who had had hold of the handles of electric machines and were mighty glad to turn loose.

In a quarrel at a baseball game here a negro struck another with a bat, smashing his skull. Death soon resulted. The slayer has fled. Charles D. Molver, State superintendent of Education and Governor Aycock today had a consultation here regarding the educational campaign for the next six or eight months. It will not be as great a campaign as usual because the political campaign is on.

It is decided to simply send speakers where they are wanted. Meanwhile the work of voting local tax for schools in various districts goes on, so far 312 districts having thus voted. When the educational campaign begins two years ago there were only 66 such districts. The counties are now beginning to do what the cities and towns have been doing for many years. Taxation of a public charter by the State and counties has been carried to the limit and now local taxation and community efforts have to do the work. Only places in North Carolina of any importance, which has no graded school and has voted no local tax is Elizabeth City, a town of 6000 people. This is very remarkable.

Cotton Condition and Acreage. Washington, D. C., June 4.—The report of the government issued today from the department of agriculture, shows the condition of the growing cotton crop to be 85 per cent, against 74.1 per cent same time in 1903. The acreage in 1904 is given as 91,750, 871 against 85,007,000 in 1903.

C. C. JONES GUILTY.

Charged With Having and Concealing Stolen Postage Stamps \$3 500 Fine.

Special to Journal. Raleigh May 4.—In Federal Court today Charles C. Jones of Goldsboro was convicted of having and concealing stolen postage stamps, knowing them to have been stolen. He was fined \$500 and sentenced to two years in penitentiary. His attorneys making great efforts to get imprisonment part of sentence remitted. Judge Farnell finally remitted the imprisonment and increased the fine to \$2,500. It is said friends of Jones offered to pay a fine of as much as ten thousand dollars if the imprisonment was remitted.
