### HEINOUS CRIME

Goldboro Negro Terrifies People of Adams Creek and Ends His Career by Criminal Assault on Small Child.

Some time ago a young negro, looking to be about 18 or 19 years of age, and claiming to be from Goldboro, showed up in the Adams Creek neighborhood. He gave the name of Alex. Sutton, and posed as a young colored gentleman of leisure. Soon after his arrival in the above neighborhood, which by the way is a very quiet, law-abiding one, strange and unusual things began to happen. Small articles of property, left exposed would turn up missing. Disturbing gossip began to circulate around among the residents which are mostly peaceable industrious colored people, and in the course of time this strange negro was supposed to be the author of all the mischief, but as no direct proof could be established, the injured parties bided their time for further developments, in the meantime giving the leisure colored gentleman the cold shoulder.

Wednesday night the residence of Leander Gilbert, a white man was broken into, the family were awakened but the would-be burglar made his escape. Thursday night the home of a very worthy old colored man by the name of Morgan was broken into, the miscreant getting into the bed room before his discovery. In this case an escape was also made.

Suspicion rested on the negro Sutton and a watch was accordingly set for him, and a search was made but without success.

Late in the forenoon, Friday, some children were playing in a field near the home of Morgan, already mentioned, when a great screaming was heard. Morgan, who was working near by went to the rescue. As he neared the place from whence the noise issued, he saw the negro Sutton leap from a ditch and speed away. Morgan followed the man and meeting a white man who had a pistol they continued the pursuit and soon captured the fleeing one.

Returning to the ditch a little colored girl about six or seven years old was found in a serious physical condition, the victim of a brute's passion.

The negro was taken before Justice of the Peace Claude Taylor who sent him up to New Bern jail to await trial at the next term of Superior Court.

Special deputy Orlando Hyman, a colored man who brought Sutton here yesterday morning said that feeling was pretty strong down there among his race against the negro and that there was a good deal of talk among them of lynching.

Sutton is now in jail here but will have nothing to say, neither denying or confessing the crime. But there is no doubt of his guilt as he was seen running from the scene of the crime even before the outcry ceased.

### New Cars Bull.

The A. & C. O. shops turned out six new big trucks yesterday. They were built for the use of minister Darlington in the transportation of convicts, large numbers of which are being placed on the road where needed.

This makes 105 of these cars built since the present administration took charge of the road. The cars are constantly engaged in hauling logs for miles along the line.

The very small and compact one which is being made in the shop for the transportation of the mails is rapidly approaching completion.

The car is of the standard type. It is 30 feet long in the clear, built on six wheel trucks, 4 feet wide and balanced in natural wood.
