The Rev. Henry C. Kinney on Saloons and Crime.

(ADV.)

The Rev. Henry C. Kinney, Rector of Holy Trinity Church, Chicago, has written the following article which was published in the Chicago Sunday Tribune.

"Recently the Tribune has been printing a good many articles on the liquor traffic, and showing the relation of the saloon to drunkenness and crime. I have taken the census returns of 1900 of the United States, the number of saloons to the population of each, the number of arrests for drunkenness and for crime, and I am prepared to say that the arrests made in these cities have no relation to the number of saloons in them.

"In making this deduction I took first the census returns on population of each city, and found the proportion of saloons to each 10,000 population. Then taking the number of arrests in that city I found the proportion of arrests in each 10,000 of population. Entering these figures in parallel columns I found some striking groups.

For instance, Chicago and Rochester, N. Y., have the same relative number of saloons, averaging a fraction more than 28 to the 10,000 of population. But while Rochester police arrested only 73.5 persons in each 10,000 for drunkenness and 44.4 for other crimes, the Chicago department arrested 297.1 for drunkenness and 647 for other crimes and misdemeanors. Taking the figures for Rochester, only six other cities of the United States had a smaller number of arrests for drunkenness in proportion to population while 53 cities showed fewer arrests for crimes in each 10,000 of population.

In the Chicago figures the city ranked 47th in the number of arrests for drunkenness, 41st in its arrests for crimes, and only 36th in the proportion for saloons.

Taking Boston, with its 149 saloons to Chicago's 98 in the 10,000, Boston had 429.1 arrests for drunkenness to Chicago's 297.1. With nearly three times as many saloons as Boston has, Chicago had only a little more than half the drunkenness coming to the notice of the police. Only 18 cities of the United States having a population of 30,000 or more, exceeded the records of Boston for drunkenness. Of these 18 cities, 100 I was sorry to find Joliet, Ill., with 479 arrests in each 10,000 and Springfield, Ill., with 409.9 all under the head of drunkenness.

But, however numerous were Joliet's arrests for drunkenness, there were only 35 of the 189 cities free from crime than it was, as to Springfield, 118 of these cities had fewer arrests for crime, leaving the Illinois capital in this respect almost at the bottom of the list.

Norfolk, Va., and Atlanta, Ga., are two Southern cities subject to comparison. Norfolk has 25.5 saloons to every 10,000 of population, while Atlanta has only 18.4 saloons to the same number. Yet Norfolk arrested a total of only 201.9 persons for all crimes, while Atlanta had 1,110.4 to each 10,000 of population.

The figures quoted have been individual. In some of my generalizations I obtained equally as startling results. I took eleven cities, for instance, which had no licensed saloons, and having a total population of 50,118. As against these I set off five cities having a total of 781,954 inhabitants, and with an average of 30 saloons to each 10,000 of population.

"In the first group, having no licensed saloons and 181,200 fewer people, I found an average of 220 arrests for each 10,000 of population, as against 100 in the second group.

NOW NEGRO PLANK

In Republican National Platform Is Viewed

Prominent State Officials Say It Bids For Northern Negro Vote. Oppressor Promising. More Aid to Orphans.

Raleigh, June 24.--Democratic politicians are talking a good deal about the negro plank in the Republican platform. Your correspondent talked over the telephone with Governor Aycock, at Greensboro, about the matter, and the Governor, when asked his view said: "In my opinion this will land the Republicans more votes than it will gain for them. The north has too much invested in the south and is beginning to understand the situation too well to be willing to join in a crusade against the south."

State Auditor Dixon was asked his opinion of the matter and replied: "It is not in the least probable that it will be carried into effect by congress. I think the plank is really a bid for the northern negro vote and that after this is secured the matter will end. This step would divide the country more than it has been divided since 1865. I do not think there is any purpose to put into effect. Meanwhile it is designed to get the negro vote in doubtful northern and western states where they may hold the balance of power."

Private secretary Pearson, ex-secretary of the Democratic State Committee said: "I think, as do all other Democrats, that it is a bid for the negro vote at the north. Its effect will be to promote bitterness of feeling between the two sections. The Republicans could not devise a scheme more odious to the people of this State. Republicans here to whose views are worth having are all at the Chicago convention, but some of the lesser lights in the party claim that the plank in the Chicago platform cuts the negro out of politics in the south, really eliminating him altogether."
