

The United States census shows that two States have decreased in popu lation. These two-Maine and New Hampshire—were prohibition States, and the loss occurred to them during a decade of intense prohibition agitation This might seem accidental if it were not given significance by the more general fact that all States, without exception, which have adopted prohibitory laws have increased in population less rapidly after their adoption than before,
