RAILROAD RUMORS.
 That P. O. & W. Road Has Been Bought By A. & N. C. Road.
 For several days there have been street reports, and rumors that the Pamlico, Oriental & Western road in course of construction, had been purchased by the Atlantic & North Carolina road, and that the latter road would finish the P. O. & W. and add it as a branch road.
 To ascertain how much there was in this report, the Journal called upon Treasurer Matt Manly of the A. & N. C. Capt Manly was told of the report, and laughing, said there was absolutely nothing in it.
 The temporary stoppage of work here on the P. O. & W. is not due to any sale or transfer of the road, as has been rumored, but on account of lack of piles of sufficient length for the bridge across the Neuse river. Piles of the needed length were secured but being light wood, were too heavy to be floated, so had to be left to dry out before they could be towed to where the bridge is being constructed. The story of the sale and purchase is like most stories at this season, purely "hot air."

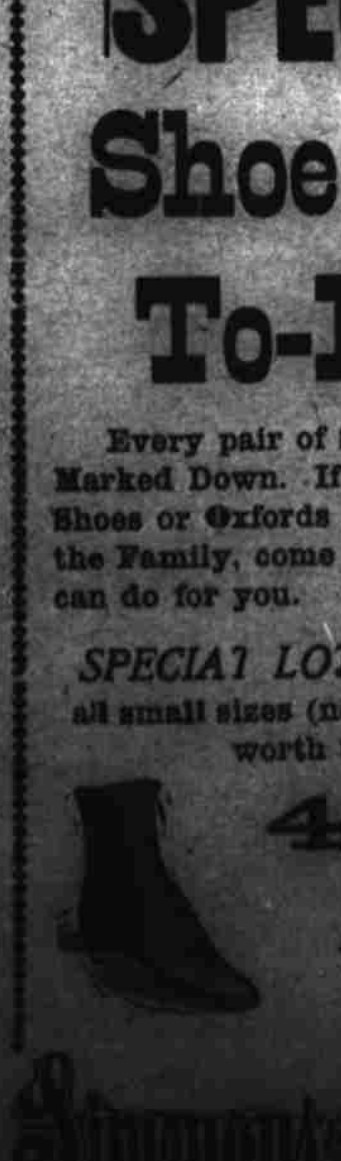
