NEW ELES BUILDING.

A Handsome Structure to be Erected on the Principal corner of the City.

As was noted in Wednesday's paper the Elks have purchased the Duffy property on the corner of Middle and Pollock streets on which G. J. McSorley's store is located and will soon make preparations to build.

The location is the best in the city and the structure anticipated will be an attractive pile.

It is expected that the building will be 100 feet deep, extending east and west and 71 feet wide. It will be four stories high. The first floor will be occupied as a store, the second for offices, the third for club purposes and the fourth will be the lodge room.

The contract has not been made nor the plans drawn, but the above idea will probably be carried out in the plans. The building will cost \$40,000.

This building will displace a frame structure that has long been an eyesore. Being located on the most prominent corner it will add greatly to the business portion of the city.
