Russia to Satisfy England

London, July 28.—Your correspondent is official informed that Lord Lansdowne has received assurances from Russia that full satisfaction will be given Great Britain in the case of the latter's steamer, the Knight Commander, which was sunk by Russia's cruisers Sunday.

ASSASSINATED AT ST. PETERSBURG.

Russian Minister of Interior Killed by Bomb Throwing. Czar Shocked By News.

London, July 28.—A correspondent of the Hunter Telegraph Co. gives the following version of Plehve's assassination. Plehve was on his way to the Peterhof palace about 10 o'clock to make a report to the emperor. When the carriage was passing in front of the Hotel de Varovie which is close to the St. Petersburg terminus of the Warsaw railway a man suddenly rushed out of a restaurant which is attached to the hotel and hurled the bomb at Plehve's carriage. The explosion was terrific. The minister and his coachman were killed on the spot, while the carriage and horses were shattered to atoms. The body of Plehve was terribly mutilated. His left arm and both legs were torn off. The bomb thrower despite the confusion, was immediately surrounded and arrested.

Berlin, July 28.—A code dispatch received from St. Petersburg states the czar received the news of M. Plehve's assassination at Peterhof. The emperor trembled and sank into a chair overcome by the shock. The St. Petersburg police already possess proof that the assassination was the result of conspiracy by the revolutionary party.
