SEVENTEEN HORSES BURNED

In Livery Stable, Warehouse Destroyed Farmers Want Rais. Clay Pigeon Shoot.

Raleigh, Aug. 24.—Fire was discovered this morning just before day light in the livery and boarding stable of Geo. H. Hardin here. When the firemen reached the place all the interior was in flames. Seventeen horses were burned in their stalls, seven of those belonging to Hardin and insured, the others belonged to private individuals and business firms. Some of them being very handsome animals. The origin of the fire is unknown. It is said that the watchman, a white man, was asleep. The building belongs to M. T. Leach and E. B. Barbee and was insured. Hardin, the lessee, is in Ball's more at the driving park, with a string of race horses. About 80 vehicles of various kinds were burned. The fire spread to a warehouse owned by W. A. Myatt, which was touched on two sides by the burning stable. Myatt has no insurance. In the warehouse were 240 bags of sugar belonging to the Haver Sugar Co., also car load lots of oats, corn, nuts, lot of molasses and several reaping and mowing machines. The loss is \$3,000 on these and \$1,400 on the sugar. The chief of the fire department says excellent work was done, but on the other hand there are criticisms of the department which is volunteer and it is said there will be a movement to secure a paid one. The fire was very near the center of the city and created a great deal of excitement. It had probably been on fire half an hour before discovered.

The farmers are becoming rather dispirited on account of the dry weather. There were earnest hopes of rain here last night, but all failed and the drought continues, all the more severe by reason of the long rainy season. State Chemist Kilgore is back here after a trip to Canada for the benefit of his health which appears to be completely restored. All day today the clay pigeon shooters were at work in the State match. Next year the Association meets at Durham, and its officers are all from that city. George L. Lyon president, James H.
