London, Sept. 3.—The Japanese lega tion have given out the following dis patch received in Tokio from Field Mar shal Oyama, reporting the retreat of the Russians under Kuropatkin from Liso Yang. The enemy being unable to re sist our fierce attack began retiring on September 1st toward Liao Yang.
