## RALEIGH.

Great Audiences Greet Aycock and Winston in Maine.

Jacksonville Supply Co Charter. Capt Day at His Office After Stokness. Large Enrollment in Schools. Sermon on Eastern War.

Raleigh, Sept 19.—The Jacksonville Supply Co., Onslow county, was chartered today with \$5,000 capital to conduct a general mercantile business. Frank Thompson, F W Hargett and C A Peterson are the incorporators. Capt W H Day, counsel for the Seaboard Air Line, and one of the most prominent lawyers in the State, was in his office today for the first time in four months. The effects of the stroke of paralysis he sustained is gradually disappearing. He still has a slight impediment of speech but is steadily regaining strength and faculties. For several weeks he was absolutely helpless and speechless.

Papers and letters from the State of Maine give very gratifying reports of the speech making tour of Governor Aycock and Judge Francis D Winston of North Carolina are now making in that State in the interest of education. A letter from State Superintendent of Education Stearns, of Maine to a friend here states that the distinguished North Carolinians are being heard by immense audiences and all give high praise to the speakers and the sentiments they express.

In a very able sermon last night at the First Presbyterian church, Dr Alfred H. Mendenhall, the pastor, declared in the course of the sermon on "Manchuria or Russia's purpose to close the doors of their East Against Protestant Christianity" that however the present struggle may terminate, whether a triumph for Russian or Japanese arms, the eastern open door for protestant missionaries will be established whereas but for the plucky struggle of Japan, Manchuria, Korea and ultimately China would surely have been dominated by the narrow arrogant church of Russia.

The Raleigh Public Schools have opened with about 3,400 pupils, the largest enrollment at any opening in the history of the schools.

The Baptist University for women opens tomorrow with the largest attendance this splendid institution has ever had. It will be probably a month before the Faircloth building will be ready for occupancy.

## 300,000 Japs Moving Towards Mukden.

Rome, Sept 19.—A dispatch to the Tribune from Liao Yang says the Japanese advance on Mukden is proceeding and that a fourth army from New Chang is now on the Russian extreme left. The dispatch also says that Korok has received two new divisions, making a total Japanese force of 800,000 men.

## Dr Baker Not Guilty.

Barboro, N. C., Sept. 19.—Yesterday afternoon about 1 o'clock the jury of the Baker-Bass case, which has been out since Saturday afternoon at 7 o'clock, came to a decision that the prisoner Dr J S Baker, was not guilty. Judge Shaw called for the prisoner and pronounced him not guilty, the case being that of justifiable homicide.

## Death of George Jackson

Kinston Free Press, 19th. Mr George A Jackson died at his late residence on east Caswell street this morning at 5 o'clock, of enlargement of the heart and asthma after a long illness which confined him to his room since April last. The burial will take place at the cemetery in this city tomorrow afternoon at 4 o'clock.

Mr Jackson was born 69 years ago in Williamsburg, Va., and just prior to the breaking out of the civil war moved to this State and when the war came on enlisted in the First North Carolina Cavalry and served through the entire period of hostilities as color bearer.

He was a brave Confederate soldier and his death makes another gap in the ranks of that fast thinking body of heroes.

He was married several years after his return at the end of the war to Miss Lizzie Brock and as a result of the union there were five children born, all of whom and the widow survive.

## Death of Prince Bismarck.

Friedrichsruhe, Sept 18.—Prince Herbert Bismarck died this morning at 10:15 o'clock. The end was painless. Since he ceased to be foreign minister on the retirement of his father in 1890, Prince Herbert Bismarck had taken part in public affairs only as a member of the Reichstag.

The title of Prince Bismarck and the large fortune of the deceased will go to his seven-year-old son Otto.

The late Emperor Frederick gave to Chancellor Bismarck extensive forests at Friedrichsruhe, which have since increased in value, and the chancellor gave to Prince Herbert \$3,400,000 in securities and cash. The estate is now estimated to be worth \$4,000,000 exclusive of the lands.
