ANOMALOUS CANDIDACY OF JUDGE ROBINSON.

The Republicans of the Third North Carolina Congressional District, flattered themselves in the nomination of Ex-Judge W. S. O. B. Robinson, that they had made a hit. They did, but it was for a greater assured victory for Charles R. Thomas, the Democratic nominee.

It is not that there is anything against the personal character of Judge Robinson, for no sturdier Irishman lives in the Third, and the good red Irish blood of the Judge, with his disposition to "talk out" regardless of men and things makes him a good companion, and as a Judge on the bench, he was as positive in his speech, as he would be among friends.

And it is this very open, out spoken characteristic of Judge Robinson, which makes his candidacy a political anomaly, for the Judge has a political record of utterances which however bold and justifiable as coming from a private citizen, cannot pass political scrutiny, and make him the truly acceptable candidate from a Republican party view.

On the temperance question, the Judge has already publicly expressed his opinion, and it is decidedly anti-North Carolina Republican. As a possible congressman, he would be at odds with the Roosevelt administration, for the recent episode in Washington City, is too well remembered to need repetition.

THE NEW TELEPHONE SYSTEM.

The Home Telephone and Telegraph Company's Establishment Greatly Improved.

The Home Telephone and Telegraph Company's new system will soon be in operation. The instruments have been placed in the homes and stores of most of the subscribers and that work is being pushed as rapidly as possible.

The central energy system by which it is known is a wonderful piece of electrical mechanism. It is so called because all power is located in the central office of the old-fashioned instruments with departments have been done away and all electrical charging is done in the local exchange. An elaborate arrangement may be seen in the Company's office by which this is done.

By means of this new system it is only necessary for the subscriber to take the receiver from the hook in order to ring up central.

The switch board though complicated to anyone not used to telephone appliances and methods will doubtless be easily mastered by the operators. By the mechanism of the new switch board operators will be able to tell where there is any difficulty on any line by the improper working of the drop signal.

The linemen will be able to make the repairs quicker than by the old method.

Subscribers will have some difficulty in getting connections when the new system is inaugurated as the operators have to learn the new switch board before they can give satisfactory service but within two weeks they expect to have it learned so that subscribers will have little or no trouble.

The new switch board and electric mechanism was purchased of the Western Electric Co. of New York and Chicago.

It was put in at an expense of \$15,000 and is the best telephone system in the world. In addition to their other improvements the company has made their lines all metallic—a feature which everybody knows by experience to be of immense advantage.

The entire work has been tedious and expensive, but the public are going to profit by it in having a system that none other can equal. We fully believe that this new system will show what the local exchange has had to contend with for all the years that it has been in existence.

The people do not know always what difficulties an exchange has to suffer through no real fault of its own.

In the future the causes of "roast" in the telephone exchange will be greatly diminished.
