NEEDED FIRE FIGHTING CHANGE

Among the needed changes, which the Journal considers New Bern should make in its municipal departments, that of a change in the fire department is one which is imperatively demanded.

i It is at this season of the year, the early cool season, when fires are first lighted, and unknown dangers lurk in flues and around fire places and chimneys, that house holders, and owners of buildings are in special anxiety about fire dangers. It is also the busy commercial season when men, young and old, are greatly occupied in attending to a constantly increasing store business. Merchant and clerk have all they can do, and customers engage their attention. Trade is good and every one is

But the fire alarm sounds, and mer chant and clerk are interrupted in their work, the customer is likely to leave and sales are lost, for with the volunteer fire department as it now is, a fire call means that those in the department must drop everything else and follow the hose wagon.

The Journal believes that the voluntary fire service in this city is out of date. That those who have contributed time, energy and inoney to this service have done enough, and they should no longer be called upon to make the personal morifice, with the oft times danger to limb and life.

New Bern has outgrown this volunteer fire department service. It has served its day, and now with a greatly increased population, a paid fire department is wanted for this city, in order that the new local conditions can be successfully met, and the burden placed where it belongs, upon those who have property that may be destroyed by the

The volunteer service means that fire rates will not decrease, rather are subject to an advance at any time, while a paid fire service mean s lower premiums to be paid by house owners.

As the Journal has said before, it repeats, that the municipal administration which brings about this much needed change will receive the congratulations from every one, - and render their constituents a service which will be ever appreciated.
