LET NEW BERN'S CITIZENS PROTECT EACH OTHER

The large attendance at the court house of citizens, merchants and business men, on last Wednesday night, is a hopeful sign that the citizenship of New Bern is not dead to its own affairs, as has been often said.

But one meeting is not enough, for there are many matters which are of vital importance to the welfare and prosperity of this city and county, which demand public attention, and which public meetings can look into and find means of correcting, which if permitted to be left alone, must ultimately lead to bad effects, and prove harmful to the commercial interests of New Bern and the people in this vicinity.

Wednesday night's meeting developed a number of topics for discussion, which were very important to the business interests of the people, not to mention their importance to the tax payers: Local indifference to municipal affairs by the voters and tax payers, has caused trouble in many cities, and severe losses to those who own property.

It is not enough that men are elected to public office. That does not end their obligation to the voter and tax payer, any more than to cast the vote to elect men to public office, is all that the tax payer has to do with the matter, or is where his interest should cease. The expressions uttered on Wednesday night showed this, and it is a healthy sign, only it should not cease, and further meetings should be held to discuss municipal affairs, and those matters which threaten the commercial interests of the people.

If these public meetings of the Retail Merchants Association or the Chamber of Commerce would be held with some regularity there would be no such losses as the removal of the A & N O office from this city, nor would there be even the threat of the removal of the A & N O railroad shops, which has appeared in the public press. Freight rates, fire insurance and storage rates would not be so easily advanced, if there was the public interest alive to local affairs, and many other local matters would never get beyond the control of the business interests of this city, with a Chamber of Commerce or a Live Merchants Association to keep watch upon the threatened commercial intrusions on local trade interests.

Protection is a local issue, and it demands that every citizen shall be quick to form a coalition with the rest of the community to set against every hostile measure, from within or without which is inimical to the local welfare. There is no special class in this protected list, but every citizen's interests demands equal protection and a unity of action will assure this mutual protection.

The insurance commissioner has approved the charter of the North State Insurance Company of Greensboro, which was recently granted. The company has begun with \$100,000 capital. Ashley Horn, W. S. Thompson and others the stockholders.
