LIBRARY FLOOR SETTLED

Causing Sensation Among Four Hundred People. Governor Appointment.

Raleigh, Jan. 20.—There was a decided sensation yesterday afternoon at the State library. The hearing of the matter of driving liquor out of Richmond county was before the committee, the room being packed, at least 400 people. Suddenly there was a crash, which was heard all the way to the basement and the floor sank about three inches at the center. The room was emptied like a flash, legislators and listeners fairly tumbling down the steps. No sign of break appears below Supreme court room being immediately underneath, but one of the beams: If not two had given away. Trouble has before occurred in same building, and four years ago steel supports had to be put under its east wing in office of superintendent of public instruction and attorney general, to support weight of newspaper rooms of State library.

HERO SEARCH STILL VAIN

Pittsburg, Jan. 18.—The Carnegie Hero Fund Commission held its annual meeting here today, and though it was expected that something definite as to awards would be announced such was not the case. The Commission, however, took a forward step in the matter of searching for men of real deeds of valor, when it appointed a special agent to make an exhaustive examination into the claims of the persons asking recognition. He is George A. Campsey, a young newspaper man, and he will report to the Commission once a month.

Mr. Campsey will not be expected to look into all of the 30,000 claims, but only those which the Commission has found to be worthy of consideration.

REPUBLICANS FOR PROHIBITION

Butler Wins Applause in House By So Declaring. Various Bills Still Coming Forward.

Raleigh, Jan. 20.—In the Senate bills were introduced to proscribe the course for absolute divorce, and to vitally amend the law regarding descents, as to legitimate and illegitimate children. Bills were passed to regulate pay of jurors on special venues in Craven county. To give superintendent of police or chief officer of a city or town, full jurisdiction of magistrate in criminal actions; to prevent injustice by hastily restraining order and injunctions without notice; to give justices of peace jurisdiction of offences of unlawfully riding on railroads; to authorize removal of actions where magistrates die or become incapacitated before final determination of action; to amend election laws so as to make it unlawful to sell liquor or give it away on election day. Bill prohibiting places having less than 300 qualified voters from authorizing manufacture or sale of liquor was made special order January 31st.

In House petition was presented for compulsory education in Carteret county. Bills were introduced endorsing the Jamestown Exposition, and urging an appropriation by Congress, to protect landlords and tenants, employers and employees; to increase appropriation of soldiers home to \$15,000 annually for maintenance, and \$5,000 this year for improvements. To forbid sale of liquors within five miles of any voting place on election day; to provide for idiots and epileptics.

The feature of the day was a bill to prohibit manufacture and sale of liquor in Richmond county. It was amended so as to make it effective July 1st. Butler of Sampson, republican, offered amendment covering the entire State.

Murphy of Buncombe asked Butler if in amendment he represented his party in North Carolina. Butler replied he represented his county, which is under prohibition, but was not making a mistake in saying that he represented the Republican party as taking that position. Great applause. McNinch, Democrat, challenged the Republicans to show a single instance in which their party had stood up for the whiskey traffic. Butler replying, said the Republican party would endorse his amendment. It was defeated 99 yeas 81 nays. The bill passed its final reading, only one adverse vote, Warburton of Richmond.

The Democratic caucus will consider next Tuesday night all matters regarding liquor traffic and bill regulating sale of corn meal, fixing standard weight at 45 lb, and also sales of bags. There was argument on the bill to permit new trial in criminal as in civil cases, for newly discovered evidence pending appeal. It was made special order next Tuesday.

Meeting of Board Aldermen

New Bern, N. C., Jan. 19th. Board met in special session, Mayor Ellis presiding. Aldermen present, Bennett, Avery, Dawson, McSorley, Phillips, Watson, McCarthy and Hollis.

Mayor stated that the meeting was called by request of five members of the Board.

Upon motion the following resolution was adopted. Resolved, to add to chapter 10, section 177 of city ordinance, that it shall be unlawful for any drug store to sell on Sundays anything but tea, ice cream to sell anything but tea, and restaurants allowed to sell meals only on Sundays. Any person violating this ordinance shall be fined ten dollars for each offence.

A communication from the chief of fire department was read to the board stating that the fire department was badly in need of fire hose.

Upon motion the Board purchased 200 hundred feet of Red Cross brand fire hose of the Kerkira Fire Hose Company for \$96 per foot. Mayor and clerk were instructed to make terms and sign contract for same.

Board took recess subject to call of Mayor.

AGAINST REPEAL

Of Anti-Jug Law by Whiskey Distiller.

Personal Staff of Governor.—Khaki Campaign Shirts.—Capitol Club Reception.—Appropriation Asked For Colored Insane.

Raleigh, Jan. 20.—Governor Glenn, under the provisions of a bill which passed yesterday, today appointed his personal staff, this now consisting of seven members, two being what are known as naval aides. The commissions were issued today to the following, all having the rank of Colonel: F. G. James, Greenville; Charles E. Johnson, Raleigh; John S. Cunningham, Person county; Westcott Roberson, High Point; John L. Cobb, Lincoln; and naval aides W. D. Pollock, Kinston and D. L. Ward, New Bern. Major W. Hopkinson Smith of Goldsboro is re-appointed assistant chief of ordinance.

Quartermaster General Macon today received khaki campaign shirts for the second and third regiments, and regulation blankets for the entire National Guard of the State. Some minor articles of equipment were also received at the arsenal.

The House and Senate committee on liquor traffic were very much surprised to receive from a whiskey distiller, in the Piedmont Section a letter urging that the Anti-Jug Law be not repealed, but that it stand for the whole state. Upon inquiry it was found that this distiller, who does a very great mill order business, is going out of the manufacture of straight whiskey and will make a drink known as "cheekers" which is along on the line of Peruns. This very beverage has landed a man in jail here for six months, and an evening or two ago your correspondent saw his wife and two little sons standing outside the jail, trying to call him and cry.

The reception which the Capitol Club gave the State officers and the legislature last evening was the most elaborate in all its history. Rather more than 1200 persons were present, and not only all of North Carolina, but several towns in Virginia and South Carolina were represented.

This morning the Commission appointed by the Governor under the new law to erect a memorial to the North Carolina troops at Appomattox met in the office of the Secretary of State and organized.

What is known as the Legislature Committee of the State Press Association met here today and appointed as the special committee to look after bills for the legislature Henry A. London, R. M. Phillips and Archibald Johnson. A bill is to be prepared giving the Corporation Commission power to allow the railroads to pay for their newspaper advertising in passes.

The Anti-Saloon League is deeply gratified at the very large attendance at its convention last night, which was in session until nearly midnight. It is felt that there must be a steady fight against liquor, with nothing taken for granted. The longer they are out of business the harder the liquor men fight. Such is the very positive statement made by members of the League.
