## VETERANS MAKE DENIAL

A STATEMENT SENT TO THE ASSEMBLY BY INMATES OF SOLDIERS HOME.

A Busy Day In Legislature. Many Bills Introduced in Both Houses. The Interests of Craven County Well Represented.

Raleigh, Feb. 8.—In the Senate a statement was read signed by all the inmates of the Confederate Soldiers Home here, denying charges made by A. C. Smith in pamphlet form.

Bills were introduced to repay ex-state treasurer W. H. Worth \$2,200 funds lost by the failure of the bank of New Hanover.

Providing for reduction of the rate of taxation.

Enlarging powers of the Corporation Commission regarding telegraph and telephone companies.

To authorize and direct a bond issue of half a million to equip the insane hospital and educational institutions with necessary buildings and other permanent improvements.

The State auditor estimates that revenue receipts will not be as large under the new revenue act as under the old one. The bond issue provides for cutting off unpopular taxes such as those on merchants, purchasers, on dentists, physicians and others.

Bills passed requiring railways to deliver freight with reasonable promptness, violations punishable by fine of \$25 for the first day for ear load lots, and in proportion for smaller quantities.

To prevent persons not member of secret organizations from wearing their emblems.

To amend the law regarding game in Gates.

To place tablets as memorial to North Carolina troops at Bethel and Chickamauga.

To regulate primary elections in Craven.

To protect sheriffs who have prosecuted persons for failure to pay taxes.

Bills were introduced in the House to regulate fishing in Pamlico and Tar rivers.

To amend to amend the act concerning regulation of telephone companies by the corporation commission.

To amend the law regarding hunting by non-residents.

To pay the county commissioners to same for special as for regular meetings.

To secure accurate reports of cotton crops.

To regulate working of public roads Craven.

To amend the law regarding deer hunting in Hyde.

To reduce the interest rate.

To amend the charter of the Howland Improvement Co.

To make obtaining goods by false representation a felony.

To protect dairymen.

Bills passed extending corporated limits of Robersonville, Martin county.

Bills passed regulating fees of Currituck commissioners and increasing pay of jurors in Currituck.

To pay witnesses in Magistrate's courts from other townships, the same fees as in superior courts.

The bill abolishing distilleries advanced came up with an unfavorable report. A motion to table defeated, 23 to 14. The bill was made special order for the 11th.

### TURMOIL IN RUSSIA

Grows Worse Instead of Better. A Score of People Killed and the Situation Grows More Serious.

Warsaw, Russian Poland, Feb. 8.—According to a report from Radom twenty workmen have been killed or wounded in strike disorders there today while at Skaraysko twenty-four have been killed and forty wounded.

Grave trouble is also reported at Kutno today. Troops have been sent to Kutno from here.

Several men were killed here today by strikers in bakeries and elsewhere where attempts were made to resume work.

Many arrests have been made. The prices of provisions have gone up. The peasants are afraid to bring in their produce. Strikers today attempted to bring out the employees of the electrical plant of the Asylum for Lunatics, but the doctors succeeded in pacifying the men.

### THE ASSASSIN KNOWN.

Heisingfors, Finland, Feb. 8.—The assassin of Soisalon Soiminen, procurator general of Finland, who was shot and killed yesterday at his residence by a young man dressed in an officer's uniform, has been identified as Karl Lenard Hohenthal, formerly a student at the Imperial Alexander university here. Hohenthal, who latterly had lived in Stockholm came to Finland January 13. He maintains obstinate silence under examination. Senator Akerman, who has assumed the duties of procurator of the senate, is directing the investigation of the crime. The wounds inflicted on the assassin by the son of Soiminen are not of a dangerous character.

### BUSINESS PARALYZED.

Batoum, Caucasasia, Feb. 8.—The strike situation here is growing worse, business is practically at a standstill, although some steamers have succeeded in getting away. Food is becoming more scarce. The military governor has issued a proclamation warning the inhabitants against assembling in crowds.

### NEW FISH IN MARKET

Mr. G. N. Ives has received a lot of cod fish and haddock from New York, and is delivering them to customers. Mr. Ives ordered these fish on account of the limited varieties in the local market. He has been able to get only mullets for some time and he believes that a supply of this excellent sea food will have a large demand among the people.

It is a rather unusual thing to order fish for this market when the shipments of this very commodity is one of the principal features for which New Bern is noted. But this has been an unusual season. The extreme cold and bad weather has cut off the fish trade very perceptibly and the only marketable fish caught in any quantity seems to be mullets and people soon grow weary of one variety.

The advent of cod and haddock will be welcomed by many.

### AN URGENT REQUEST.
