New Bern, N. C., Feb. 7th.

The Board of Aldermen met in regular monthly session, Mayor Ellis presiding.

Aldermen present, Bangert, Smith, Dawson, Lann, McSorley, Wood, Phillips, Watson and Guion. Minutes read and adopted.

Policies of insurance on city property was upon motion referred to Finance committee.

Petition from O. A. Kafer, was read to the Board asking permission to keep his bakery shop open on Sunday until 9 o'clock mornings to sell bread, upon motion the request was granted.

The following communications from Water & Light Commission was read to the Board and upon motion was referred to Water & Light Committee and City Attorney and report to the Board.

New Bern, N. C., Feb. 7. 05.
To the Hon. Mayor and Board of Aldermen,

City of New Bern, Gentlemen: At a meeting of the Water & Light Commission, held last evening it was decided to ask you to pass an ordinance making it a misdemeanor for anyone to leave a faucet open "running", as is now the prevailing custom on cold nights, the practice being so common that it has become impossible to pump water sufficient to maintain the required pressure.

In case of fire the supply would be inadequate and much damage might result therefrom. With respect,
