Cosby & Williams' Foundry Destroyed by Fire.

The foundry of Cosby & Williams' machine shop was destroyed by fire last night about nine o'clock. The fire had obtained a good headway before it was discovered and there was a big blaze giving rise to fears that other buildings adjacent would go also.

The firemen worked hard, however, and in a remarkably short time had the fire under control. The flames being confined almost entirely to the foundry and rear part of the store house. The machine shop was not damaged to any great extent.

Mr. Cosby was seen last night and stated that he had not made an estimate of the loss, but did not think it would be over \$1,000. There was no insurance.

The cause of the fire is not known. The only fact in connection with it is that the fire caught from the boiler room.

The water works and the two engines were hard at work on the fire and the firemen had an important assistant in the heavy down pour of rain.

### New Treatment of Lumber.

A novel method for increasing the usefulness of lumber has been perfected in England. The method consists, in brief, in replacing the air in wood with a solution of best sugar and removing the excess of water by a subsequent drying. The inventor of the process, Mr. Powell, states his object by using a large boiler in which the timber to be treated is placed and the best sugar solution prepared in. After the air has been replaced by the solution the wood is dried. Examination of the wood reveals to show that the sugar is absorbed into the fibers of the wood and is not simply held in the interstices.

It is claimed that timber treated in this way is no longer porous, will not absorb or warp, and is stronger, heavier and more durable. Moreover, it is said that the wood is less liable to dry rot; it is lighter than by using the proper amount of sugar and the wood will be more resistant to the attacks of insects and fungus. ### REPORT AGAINST EXTENSION

Of A. & N. C. Railroad Charter By Senate Committee. Howland Largely Represented By Legal Talent.

Raleigh, Feb. 20.—The Senate railroad committee tonight by a vote of five to three agreed to report unfavorably, the bill to extend the charter of the Atlantic & North Carolina railroad asked for by Howland Improvement Company and recommended by Governors Aycock and Glenn. Ex-gov. Jarvis Ex-attorney General Theodore Davidson and W. C. Munroe, attorneys representing the State, made argument favoring the bill showing that extension of charter was guaranteed in contract of lease. The lease was for 99 years; while the charter has only forty-five more years.

Opponents of extension claiming that freight rates had been raised already in violation of lease, advocated delay until another session of legislature to see whether improvements guaranteed by leases and freight rates clause were lived up to the State.

Senator Ward, T. C. Wooten and other attorneys from New Bern and Kinston represented objections.
