Raleigh, N. C., Feb. 21.—Opinions were handed down as follows today by the Supreme Court:

Ferguson vs Twisdale, from Halifax, Reversed.

Vinson vs Knight from Hertford, affirmed.

Ferry vs Ins. Co. from Halifax, affirmed.

Ward vs Gay, from Gates, new trial.

Brewster vs Elizabeth City from Pasquotank, new trial.

Bray vs Williams from Currituck, affirmed.

Lewark vs Railroad from Currituck, affirmed.

Richardson vs Oil Co. from Beaufort, per Curiam, affirmed.

Rogers vs Dispensary from Hertford, per Curiam, affirmed.

Pinchback vs Mining Co., from Gaston, per Curiam, petition to rehear dismissed.

Westfelt vs Adams from Hawwood per Curiam, the court being evenly divided (Hoke J not sitting) the petition to rehear is dismissed.

Powerful Beef Trust Banditti.

No region of this country escapes the exorbitant demand of the Beef Trust except by not using any product that is carried in a refrigerator-car. It is just as bad for New York as it is for Chicago; it is the same in Boston as in St. Paul. I have seen bills consigned here being compelled to pay that charged \$45 for ice (fifteen tons) at a time of the year when the ice in the car would not melt at all unless a fire were built underneath. Fruit used to be carried in refrigerator-cars from the Michigan region to Boston without "icing" charges. When the gouging game began the charge was made \$20 a car. Next it was elevated to \$40 a car. It is now \$55 a car, and the price of ice has not advanced a cent. The railroads are forced to assist the Trust operations to send out the circulars announcing the new rates, to collect the tribute, and to turn it over without deduction to the gentlemen who conduct the Trust. They are even obliged to browbeat and threaten those who object to the extortions, to blacklist and try to ruin them, and to fight the Trust's cases in the courts. A more extraordinary situation has never been known in this country. The railroads have been driven to abdicate their own legal and indubitable rights to assist the banditti of an enjoined combination.—Charles Edward Russell in the March instalment of "The Greatest Trust in the World," in Everybody's Magazine.

In House bills were introduced to complete construction and drainage of Trenton and Core Creek road in Jones and Craven counties, and Quaker bridge road in Jones and Onslow counties.

The increased passenger service should greatly accommodate the people traveling to and from that portion of the A. & N. C. R. R. between New Bern and Morehead City depot.
