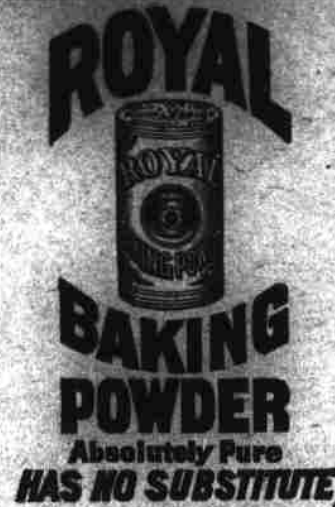

### A ROCK CRUSHING PLANT

Will Be Established in New Bern in a Short Time.

The lot at the corner of George and South Front streets belonging to the Eubanks estate has been leased for a term of years to the company with which Mr. Council Brown is interested and a rock crushing plant will be instituted thereon. Mr. Brown has been in the city for several days and has most of his plans made for the commencement of the work. The entire outfit for the plant has been purchased of a Boston manufacturing company and the work of building the mill will be started soon. It is expected that the capacity of the mill will be about 100 tons per day.

The facilities for the supply of rock to be crushed are excellent and the product will be the finest kind of material for macadamized roads. The industry will doubtless prove a good thing for New Bern when it is established as there is a great demand for a good and substantial, and cheap material for making bad roads good, and good roads better.

Pastor of First Baptist Church Soon to Take Leave.

The members and attendants of the First Baptist church were greatly surprised and grieved Sunday morning, when the pastor, Rev. C. C. Cox, publicly announced his resignation (which will take effect Sunday, May 7th). The reason for this change is that Mrs. Cox's health requires a different climate and while he regrets the action he feels compelled to make the change. Mr. Cox's pastorate over the church has been very short, having only taken charge of the church about six months ago. He has, however, gained a great many friends and admirers in the city on account of his ability as a preacher. He is forceful, logical and earnest. A deeply consecrated man and makes the call of the Gospel, clear and plain. He is an energetic and faithful pastor. He came to this church from Richmond, Va. having the best of recommendations, which he has faithfully maintained.

### SHOOTER CAUGHT AND ESCAPED.

Negro Shoots a Colored Man, Is Caught by the Wounded Man's Father Lodged in Jail and Breaks Away.

George Harper shot a colored man named Rufus Carter Sunday noon. The trouble arose over a trivial affair and involved the wounded man's younger brother. Harper laid the blame of the shooting on the man who put the pistol in his hand and told him to shoot. The matter had not taken a serious turn until the shooting Carter had gone to the assistance of his brother and Harper turned on him and was fighting him when the shooting occurred.

The ball was a 32 calibre and entered the thigh. The wound is painful but it is not thought that it will be dangerous. It is said that five shots were fired but only one took effect. The fight occurred near the junction of the A. & N. C. & P. O. & W. Railways. The men are laborers employed in the construction of the last mentioned road.

Harper is said by many to be a desperate character. He is from Greenville and killed a man there about two years ago and his record is anything but savory.

Yesterday morning he was caught by the father of the wounded man brought down and lodged in the city jail. He had not been confined there an hour before he had torn the iron grating from the window and made his escape. It is thought that he lit out toward Reelsboro where he had been working and evidently hopes to escape detection in the thick woods and among so many men of his race.

His description is as follows:—  
Age 22 or 23 years, height 5 feet 6 inches, weight 140 pounds, color, black, scar about the size of a 25 cent piece on side of neck. He wore a white hat, dark striped clothes, shoes worn and broken out at the side, red socks striped with black.

### U. S. Commissioners Court.

Capt. A. W. Golden, of the schooner Mystery, was before U. S. Commissioner Charles B. Hill Monday charged with violating section 5347 of the revised statutes of the United States, by ill-treating his crew and withholding from them suitable food and nourishment. From the evidence for the Government sufficient cause was found to hold defendant to next United States Grand Jury under bond of \$600 for appearance at next term of the United States District Court. Defendant gave the required bond and was released from custody.

### An Infant Town.

The town of Monticello, N. C., which was incorporated in 1820 and which was a prosperous settlement, has now withered and is about to surrender its town organization. On March 1, 1904, its population had dwindled to twenty-eight, and every one in town was either a Sanyer or a Roberts. Every body was related to everybody else. The community has become literally a family affair. At present the town has no postoffice, no clergyman, no lawyer and no physician. Among the assets of the once flourishing municipality is a weed grown cemetery in which there has been no interment for six years.
