Coroner's Jury Excuses Him From All Responsibility For The Death of Mary Stiles.

The coroner's jury finished its work in the case of the accidental killing of Mary Stiles, yesterday. Following is the verdict.
"We, the coroner's jury empanelled to investigate the cause of death of Mary Stiles, do hereby render the following verdict: That death resulted from accident by A. & N. C. railroad train and acting upon the evidence we find that while sufficient time for her to get off the track she was unable to do so on account of her panic stricken condition and that engineer N. H. Russell shall be exonerated."
