Perhaps one of the best and strong est evidences of the world's moral improvement, is to be found in the condemnation, which is becoming more able trade or business methods of getting money, if not riches.

The weight and power of money is very terrible in its strength, and ability to accomplish things, but it cannot be fully substanciated in this day that money can control every thing, can purchase men and women as though they were chattels, and absolutely crush any power that might be aimed against its demands in wrong doing.

This does not mean that men and women cannot be bought, or that souls will not be exchanged for wealth, but each year there is an increasing force for good, for morality, and character, which places manhood and womanhood further beyond the comparison of their lent.
