RALEIGH'S SECOND PRIMARY.

Governor Glenn Delivers Religious and Educational Address. Judge Purnell at New Bern.

Raleigh, N. C. April 24.—An immense congregation assembled yesterday afternoon at Tabernacle Baptist Church to hear the address by Governor Glenn before the B. Y. P. U. on the subject "Shall We Reject The Master?" and every one was delighted. He lamented the fact that so many people do not really want to receive the Master in their lives. That they would have to change their mode of living, their business, their methods in politics and other relations of life. He dwelt on the great need for the influence of devout christian living in business, in the affairs of the city, the state and the nation—and urged that voters see to it that none but christian men are elevated to positions of public trust.

Judge Purnell left this morning for New Bern where he goes for the purpose of hearing the writ of habeas corpus that he issued Saturday in the case instituted in the state court at Beaufort against C. B. Jones, collector of elections for the port of Beaufort, for violating the immigration laws of the state. The contention of the government is that Jones was acting within his duties as acting shipping commissioner in signing papers for the moving of certain fishermen from this state to Virginia. Collector of Internal Revenue Duncan says that if the fishermen of that section are hampered by this state emigration law, by having captains of vessels pay \$100 license tax before they can employ a seaman it will mean a great hardship and limit the livelihood of many of these people about Beaufort to two or three factories for a livelihood.

Gov. Glenn left this afternoon for Clarkton to deliver the address for the closing of the high school there. He goes to Greensboro tomorrow to deliver the address for the A. & M. College, colored, there and will deliver an educational address in advocacy of graded schools at Sanford tomorrow night.

Raleigh is in the midst of a hard fight in connection with the second democratic primary to be held tomorrow for the nomination of a candidate for mayor, police justice and city tax collector. It looks now like the result will be very close in the mayoralty fight between Johnston and Stronach and that Thomas Badger will defeat B. C. Beckwith for police justice. C. F. Lumsden will certainly secure the renomination for tax collector.

RUSSIANS GOING NORTH

Secretive on Their Part.

St. Petersburg, April 24.—Vice Admiral Rojestvensky continues his policy of strategic silence, and has answered the Admiralty's message of last Saturday, pointing out the position of the French government on neutrality regulations, only by putting to sea, giving no intimation of his plans or destination. Russian naval circles would not be surprised if it should develop that the squadron had been already two days or more on the way northward when the instructions were cabled to him, and that the Admiralty was aware of this when the message was sent asking the Admiral to move outside the three-mile limit if he happened to be in French territorial waters.

London, April 24.—Beyond the report that from Kamranh Bay the Russian Second Pacific Squadron proceeded northward, there is no further news of any kind nor confirmation of the report of firing off Kamranh Bay. There have been rumors recently that a portion of Rojestvensky's squadron was at Hainan, near the promontory of Lienchu. If these rumors are true, it is supposed the whole squadron may reassemble there and endeavor, in Chinese waters to continue coaling and other preparations.

Little attention is paid here to reported movements of the Japanese warships. It is considered that Vice Admiral Togo is not likely to lift the veil of secrecy for the express purpose of misleading.
