STRANDED AND DESTITUTE.

Three Ship-Wrecked Sallors Reach This Port Wednesday and Tell of Unusual Maritime Disaster

Henry Lanken, three able bodied seanen arrived on the 9 o'clock train Monday morning from Morehead City and reported the casting away of the vessel upon which they were employ-

The ill-fated ship was a three masted schooner three hundred and eight tons burden, the D, D. Haskell, Captain Ernest Torroy, of Deer Island, Md., and sailed light from New Conn., April 30th bound for Brunswick, Ga., for a cargo of lumber.

It seems that the voyage must have been a long tedious one as nine days had been consumed in making the place of the accident. No particulars as to the cause of the slow progress could he ascertained, the sailors being somewhat reticent, not wishing to say anything that would reflect on their captain. It seems that some miscalculation had been made and the vessel grounded before the nearness of land was real-

The accident occurred Tuesday morning at 1:30, the schooner running hard and fast upon Core Bank. All efforts to release her being of no avail.

At 3 o'clock the life saving crew of Core Bank sighted the wreck and went to the rescue, but it was not effected until six o'clock in the afternoon.

Three of the seamen immediately set out for Atlantic and from there were transported to Beaufort, thence to New Bern, where they arrived as above stated, and where they are waiting to secure passage to their homes. The remainder of the crew, the captain and three others are still at Atlantic. It is said that there is no hope to save the vessel, and that it is fast going to
