The Truck Movement.

The season for the shipment of peas is nearly over. It has been a very unsatisfactory season for the farmers, low prices and only moderate crops have repaid them but little. The shipment by the steamer Neuse was 500 baskets. The price paid in the Northern markets ranged from 40 to 75 cents. There were no local market quotations.

Cabbages were commanding a better price than heretofore and the shipment was heavier; about 1200 crates went by the Neuse. Market quoted at \$1.50. The truck train carried two car loads from here composed mostly of cabbages.

Stiff Ruling Against Vagrants.

Wilmington Messenger 12th. Mayor Waddell has determined that Wilmington shall be free of vagrants and has sent out warning to this effect. The result has been that many localities where negroes were wont to assemble are now free from their presence and if they are seen loafing around again they will be arrested and it will be up to them to show that they are not vagrants. The police are on the lookout and worthless characters, white and black had best get to work or find some other place than Wilmington to loaf in for Mayor Waddell says they have got to work and if they will not work of their own volition he will send them to the roads.
