**RALEIGH.**

**White Boy Held For Assaulting Negro.** Supreme Court Decision. No Summer School at A. & M.

Raleigh N. C. May 17.—Yesterday afternoon, Howard Rogers, a white boy, became involved in a row with a negro about his age. The negro applied a vile epithet to him and Rogers seized a base ball bat and struck the negro over the head, inflicting a wound that it was at first thought was not serious. However late last night there were serious developments and the white boy was placed in the city prison the opinion of the physicians at the hospital being that the negro could not live. His death is still expected at any time. The white boy, Rogers, is the son of a respected blacksmith on Wilmington St.

Appeals in three murder cases were settled yesterday in the Supreme court. The convictions and sentences in two, State against Will Adams from Wake and State vs Garland from McDowell, being affirmed and a new trial awarded in the case of B. F. Blivins from Mitchell county. The ruling in the Adams case means that Adams must hang for the murder of Mary Briggers and two children near Raleigh two years ago, and Garland, from McDowell must serve a seven years sentence for killing Iva Calicut, colored, because the negro refused to put some wood in the stove in the depot at Marion in December 1904. Blivins was convicted of manslaughter for the killing of J. J. Buchanan as he claimed, in self defense. The new trial is because the trial judge failed to present the self defense feature of the case in the light that the defense asked that it should be in his charge.

It has been definitely settled that there will be no Summer school at the A. & M. College this year owing to the fact that the allowance from the Peabody fund is no longer available and it is found to be impossible to raise \$1500 among the business men of Raleigh toward the expenses of the school.

The Odd Fellows of Raleigh last night celebrated the election of Mr. Perrin Busbee of this city as Grand Warden in the Grand Lodge of North Carolina.

The A. & M. College has employed Geo. S. Whitney of New York as coach for the A. & M. College Foot Ball team next season. Last season he coached the Sawnee University team which lost only one game during the season. A. & M. has the best prospect for a successful football season in the history of A. & M. athletics.

Sanders and Mrs. Taylor of Carerest, and Mrs. Nash Matlock, and Mrs. Mollie Matlock of Stella. Everybody ate all they wanted, and there were many baskets of fragments left.
