C., June 2.-Governor Glenn fixes the dates of the encampment of National Guard as follows: At Wrightsville, beginning July 20th, continuing six days, Second and Third Infantry: at Charlotte beginning August 3, continuing six days, First Infantry and Light Battery. The Governor requests the nava department to furnish a gunboat for the use of the naval nspected. It is said the equipment last year was very fair.
