The section of the State through which the Raleigh and Pamlico road will pass, has voted bonds, and the people are greatly interested in the road's extension. Sixteen miles from Raleigh are already completed and work is now going on. Near Washington, by January first, it is planned that one hundred convicts will be at work, grading through Chocowinity Swamp, and the builders are taking up the construction along the entire line.

The people of this county, through which the road would pass need the outlet which such a railroad would give them. It is a matter demanding their attention and action, and they should seek full information on the matter and be prepared to act decisively when the question is brought up for their votes.
