## Distribution of Mulberry Trees

The N. C. Department of Agriculture delightful place for the up country boy will beginning November 15. distribute among the farmers of the State 20,000 edling white mulberry trees.

This distribution is intended to encour age the growing of silk in North Caroina, but the trees will at 'the same time furnish shade and food for poul try and hogs. Every farm in the State should have a mulberry grove The trees should be planted 12x12 fee At the moment a negro leaped out of building, school houses, churches, and on dry soil and cared for like peach or plum trees.

These trees will be sent by fail, post paid, in packages of 50 to 180. Not ess than 50 nor more than 100 trees will be sent to one address.

To cover cost of packing and mailing applicants must enclose one cent for each tree. Postage stamps accepted.
