## FOR PROHIBITION

Gov. Glenn Speaks at Liquor Contest at Goldsboro.

Newsboy Killed by Jumping from Train. State Charters Granted. Evening Times Gets Outfit. S. A. L. Has Foot Ball Seats. Personal.

Raleigh, N. C., Nov. 13th, 1905.—Gov. Glenn spoke at Goldsboro last night in the interest of prohibition and says his audience was one of the finest he ever addressed, completely filling the opera house. The issue there is prohibition or saloons. He says all the leading men are for prohibition and that they declare that it will be carried by a good majority.

On the Governor's return towards Raleigh a horrible accident occurred. At Princeton a newsboy named Sikes, who runs on the train, and who lives there, attempted to jump from the moving train, his basket caught and he was thrown against freight cars and his skull crushed, death being almost instantaneous.

Charters are granted to the Home Mfg. The Evening Times which has bought the Morning Post outfit will have four typesetting machines and two presses. It takes the full associated press afternoon telegraph service. On the staff are editor-in-chief Simpson, who came here from the Greenville, S. C. News; Sanford L. Rotter, associate editor; Willis G. Briggs, city editor; with D. H. McLean and George Hall assistants.

President George T. Winston, of the Agricultural and Mechanical College, left today for Washington to attend the convention of agricultural colleges. He says there will be a special textile course of ten weeks at the textile school at the college open to men and women, the total cost, including board being only \$60. All the sick cadets at the college, including Ewert and Sullivan, who had typhoid fever are convalescing.

Staples Fuller, Esq., who has had diptheria, was able to be out at his office today for the first time in several weeks.

The Seaboard Air Line which bought 300 desirable seats on the North Carolina side for the foot ball game at Norfolk on Thanksgiving Day has sold about half of these and the sales are being made very rapidly.

Oats' head was a mass of bruises and wounds which looked as if he had run into a barbed wire fence. The gist of it all was that in a scrap Oats pulled his gun and shot at Odum, whereupon the latter didn't take it as a joke and got the revolver away from Oats and beat him good.

The men were taken before the Mayor who bound them over for trial in Superior court under \$50 bonds. Both are held for assault with deadly weapon.
