KEEP GOING TO GET THINGS.

The Journal has already noted, locally, that an important meeting is to be held in Washington, D. C. the middle of next January, the meeting is at the River and Harbor Congress, and its business is along lines which every business interest of New Bern is concerned.

The meeting of the United States Engineers in this city a few weeks ago, is not all that the people of New Bern are called upon to do, just give a slight entertainment to the visitors, and in a public meeting make a few speeches.

It is only necessary to look back and remember the years of work which Congressman John H. Small has given to the Inland Waterway project, to see how much is necessary to get even to the point already attained, that is secure United States Engineers to make the survey. The Inland Waterway is not assured by any means, and it is not for any person to sit down and say that it only needs Congressional action, when appropriations will be voted and work started.

There is a good deal to be done before this waterway is assured and the citizens who live in this section ought to hold up the hands of their congressmen Small and Thomas in their efforts. The Washington meeting is an important one, and at this and every meeting in which this Inland Waterway project may be concerned, there should be representative citizens sent to look after what is done may be done to forward the project.

There is only one way to get anything and that is by going after it until it is secured. And this Inland Waterway project is no exception to the rule. New Bern should be as active as any city or town in Eastern Carolina in its endeavors to help this waterway project to its completion.

Defender of Antisemitism. The recent resignation of Constantin Petrovitch Pobedonostzeff, chief procurator of the holy synod of the Greek church, removes from public affairs in Russia the head and front of antisemitism. During his long life he has been the servant and adviser of three emperors, a defender of antisemitism and a powerful foe of anything approaching representative government. He is the most hated man in Russia. Pobedonostzeff, seventy-three years old, is a cold, emotionless ascetic. The son of a university professor, he was born in Moscow, educated in the government Institute of Law and became a teacher there. Alexander II, in 1872 appointed him a member of the imperial council and in 1880 procurator of the holy synod. Alexander II, made Pobedonostzeff tutor of his sons Nicholas and Alexia.

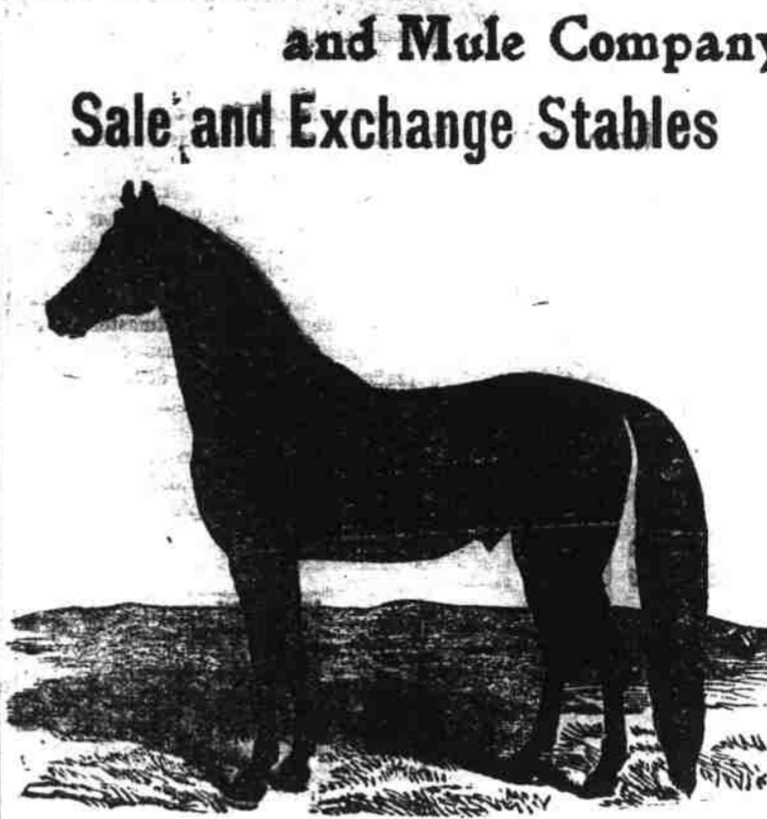

Notice of Election.

By Board of Commissioners of Craven county, adopted the 6th day of November 1905, notice is hereby given that there will be an election held in No. 2 township, in Craven county, on Tuesday the 12th day of December, 1905 according to the law and regulation provided for the election of the members of the General Assembly, to the law and regulation subscription or no subscription of the second mortgage, five per cent, thirty year bond of the Raleigh and Pamlico Sound Railroad Company of No. 2 township, of Craven county, to the amount of ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars, in accordance with the petition this day filed before the said Board of Commissioners will be permitted to the qualified voters of said township.

That the charter of the said Raleigh and Pamlico Sound Railroad Company provides that said company be issued second mortgage bond to an amount, not exceeding the amount of three thousand (\$3,000.00) dollars per mile, for a purpose of aiding in the construction of said railroad. Principal of said bond to be due in thirty years after date of issue.

And the Charter of said Raleigh and Pamlico Sound Railroad Company further provides that in a county, town ship, city or town, in or through which said railroad or its branches may be located, or that may be interested in its construction, may subscribe in the second mortgage bond any such sum as the majority of the qualified voters of said county, township, city or town may authorize. Said subscription may be made in coupon bond, bearing interest at five per cent. Principal to be due and payable thirty years from date of issue.

This election to be held on the said 12th day of December 1905, in township No. 2, Craven county, is to ascertain whether the majority of the qualified electors in said township favor said subscription of ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars, in thirty year, five per cent bond to the said second mortgage bond of said Raleigh and Pamlico Sound Railroad Company.

Notice is hereby further given, that by order of said Board of Commissioners of Craven county, acting for township No. 2 in said county, adopted on the 6th day of November 1905, there will be a new registration for said election. The registration books will be open for registration in the various voting places in said township No. 2 of Craven county, on Thursday the 9th day of November 1905. Said registration books will be closed on Saturday the second day of December 1905, at sun set. The registrars for said election are required to keep the registration books open from 9 a. m. until sunset each day (except Sundays) until said books are closed at sun set on Saturday the second day of December 1905 and on each Saturday during the period of registration, and on Thursday and Friday preceding the registration, the registrars shall open their books at each polling place in the various precincts in said township for the registration of said voters.
