

RUSSIA'S POLITICAL BASTILE

Troops Mutiny And Demand The Release Prisoners From Torture House.

St. Petersburg, Dec. 9.- A seriou mutiny has occurred at Schousselberg, a fortress known as the Russian bastile, which is located on an island in the Neva river, twenty miles east of St. Petersbusg. The troops there are demanding the release of all political prisoners and threaten to carry the fortress by assault unless their de mands are complied with. This fortress for the past nineteen years has been the torture house of Russia for political offenders. Many of the dungeons are below high water level and the prisoners are half drowned when the tide rises. There are many instances where the prisoners have been driven insane by the torture. The fare of the pris oners consists of bread, raw cabbage and water. The government never grants permission for any one to enter the prison.
