Church Gets Valuable Option.

Announcement is made by Rev. Dr. J. R. Howerton, chairman of the special synodical committee of the Presbyterian church of North Carolina, that an option has been secured on the magnificent Mount Zion estate in Black Mountain township, this county, and an outline made of the practical and feasible plan by which the purchase funds may be secured. The synodical committee has secured the option on Mount Zion until September 1, 1906. The estate is to cost \$42,000, the exact amount that John S. Huyler, the owner, has spent upon it, the interest on the investment not included. Of the \$42,000 there will be paid in cash \$25,000 while deferred stock will be issued for the remaining amount. It is estimated, however, that \$50,000 will be necessary to purchase the property and make needed improvements and the efforts of the committee will be directed towards securing this amount.

THE ART AND TASK OF CHRISTMAS GIVING.

With most people Christmas giving is a problem, which is not always satisfactorily solved when the gifts are bought and given. There is an art in successful gift bestowing which may in some degree be natural, but which in most instances demands years of cultivation.

At this season of the year with every one who gives, it is either a question of art or a task in their securing and giving presents at Christmas.

The task of Christmas giving is made so, because of human vanity or selfishness, or a combination of both. There is gift presentation which has for its sole purpose, the object of paying an obligation. There is also the gift sent that the sender may receive one in return. These are not Christmas gift giving, although they parade under such a name, for neither is prompted by love, or the thought of a single good impulse, that would raise the sender in the love and esteem of the receiver. Gift giving in its high and true sense, is not impelled by vanity or any sordid feeling, and sending gifts to be known and heralded, or to impose a counter obligation are prompted by no genuine heart emotions.

While it may be called an art, to give presents, naturally, that is so the recipient shall not feel the present, but simply recognize the spirit of love or friendship, of which it is the bearer, it is an art of naturalness, of open heartedness, of sincerity, which can not fail to produce the right effects, for Christmas gifts should not be given as a payment of an obligation, a squaring of a personal account which is to suffice for the ensuing year.

It is the art of giving at this holiday time, which places an added value to every present, cost what it may, for the recipient never figures on the dollars or cents that the present may have cost the sender, but the value is marked in the love or esteem which the receiver believes prompted the sending.

Without the art, the heart naturalness, there is a burden in Christmas giving. Not that it is applicable to quite "more biased to give than to receive," for it is not in the charity sense that this is written. But between relatives and friends, there need not be the task so often felt, nor will it be a task or problem, when the gift sending is rightly prompted, by feelings which are sincere, freighted with love, which will make the gift but the conveyer of the good will, the esteem, the love of the sender to the receiver.

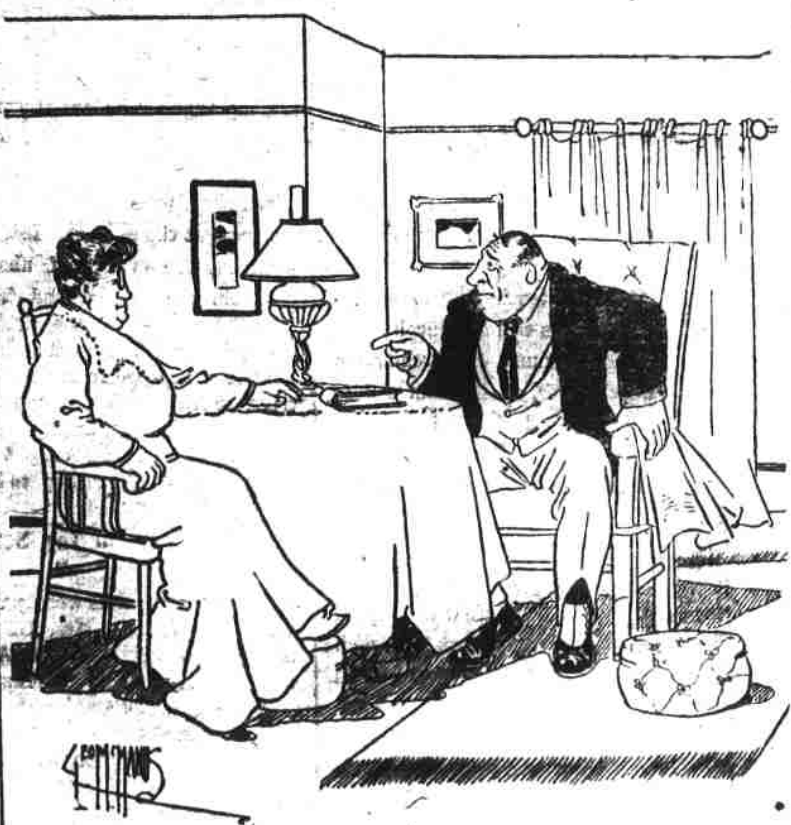

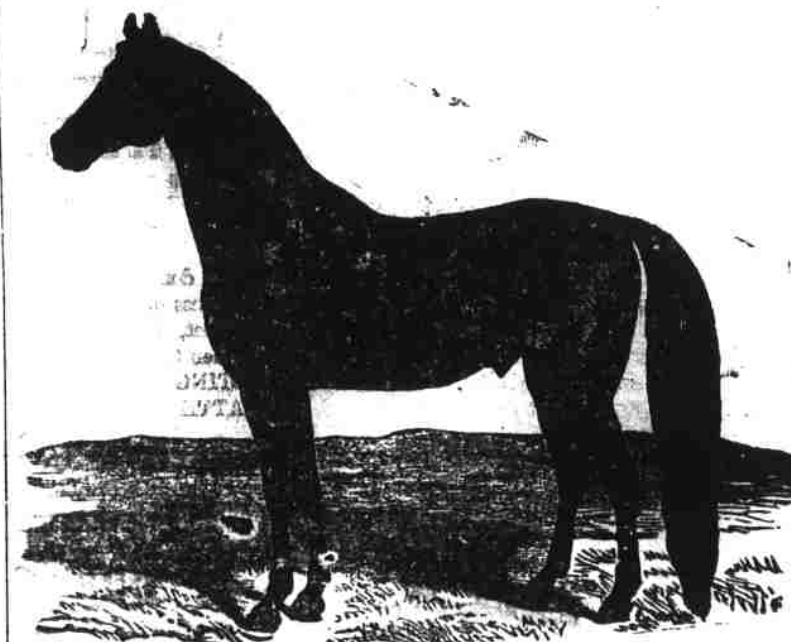
