

TEMPERANCE EVERY WAY PROFITABLE.

Temperate living has long been preached from the pulpit, and declared by the moralist writer for the personal physical benefit, and the individual profit as it might keep those so inclined from harmful dissipation.

But in this age, while the educational movement for temperate living is more strongly proclaimed and advocated, yet there are outside influences which declare the commercial and financial value for those of temperate habits, which are as important factors in helping the cause of temperance, as those which urge temperance on purely physical grounds.

A notable instance in this financial value of temperance, is seen in the action of a Swiss life insurance company which offers a premium to those of temperate habits, the members of a temperance society of railroad employes being charged four per cent less premium, than employees who were not members of the organization.

Among railroad people, it has been the aim to take men who were not drinkers or cigarette smokers, and among some leading railroads, men who use either liquor or smoke cigarettes cannot get or hold their positions on these roads.

In the matter of insurance companies it would seem the only wise policy for every company to make the temperate pay extra premiums, for it is such persons who make the losses, and especially should the temperate pay extra as members of benevolent or fraternal organizations, where the members are taxed for each death.

As each year passes, education showing the value of temperance will prove of great value to the coming race, and as the money value of temperance is better known and appreciated, there will be more demands, that men and women must be temperate in order to secure profitable positions, to say nothing of the value which temperance works for human progress and the up-building and advancement of mankind.

Mr. Howland's interest was sold to Mr. Perry J. Marsden, U. S. Senator Nelson Aldrich and other Rhode Island capitalists connected with the Rhode Island company, which owns practically all the street railways and electric plants in Rhode Island.

These facts were developed yesterday when Mr. Howland's representative was asked about a law suit which has been brought by Mr. R. F. Foster against Mr. Howland for damages for breach of contract.

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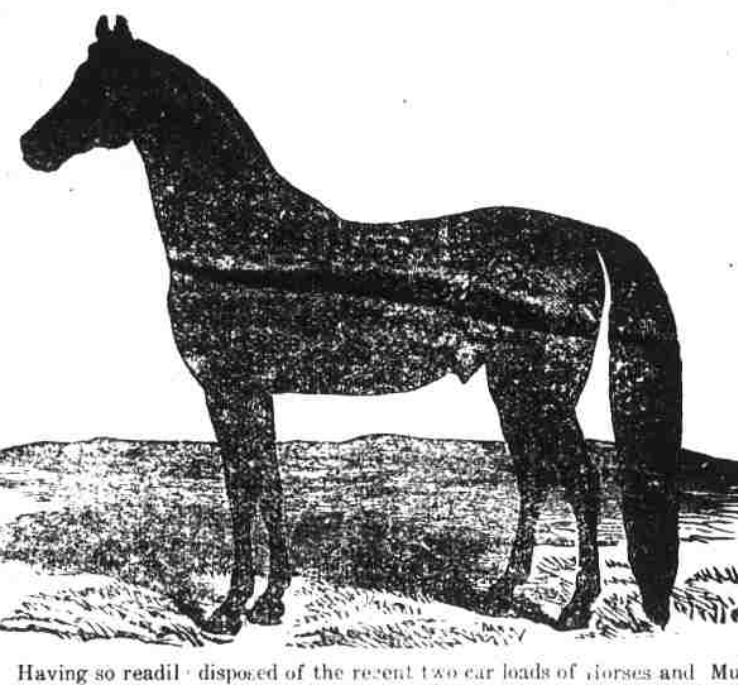

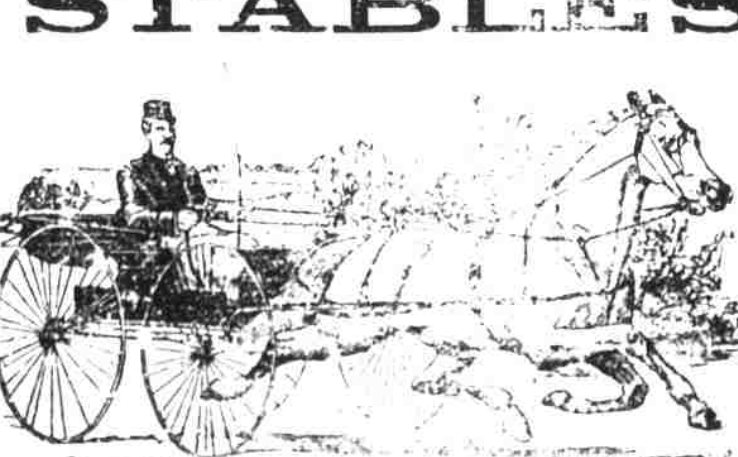
