RUSSIA'S BALTIC PROVINCES. Local Authorities Resuming Control After Revolutionists are Crushed. St. Petersburg, Jan. 5.--The Associated Press has been permitted to inspect a report prepared for the emperor regarding the situation in the Baltic provinces. The report declares that though open revolt has been crushed in many parts of the provinces and though the local authorities who were deposed by the revolutionists are resuming the reins of government under the protection of the troops, the situation is still a very serious one.
