IN SEARCH OF RELICS.

Col. F. A. Olds, of Raleigh, traveling the State in the interest of Hall of History.

Col. F. A. Olds arrived in the city last night from Wilmington on his tour of the older towns of North Carolina. He comes in a triple capacity as director of the Hall of History of the State Museum, as chairman of the museum committee of the North Carolina Literary and Historical Association; and as special representative of the North Carolina Historical Commission. His object is to secure any of those things which have gone to make history in North Carolina in the shape of books, letters, objects of any kind as uniforms, etc., covering all periods from the earliest settlement of the State.

This week at school is being reviewed as a review week and a thorough review is made of the work for the past four months. Every pupil in school should be present this week and go over the review work in order to be ready for next week. Every pupil in the schools should be present very day next week, and it is hoped that the parents will send the children to school unless they are too sick to come.

One of the greatest draw-backs to the school work at present is the very irregular attendance of some pupils. Every day quite a number of boys are absent and for no good reason. At times the excuse given by the parents is that they could not make the boy go to school, and so he loafed the streets for the day. If the parents would only send the children to school everyday, at least 25 per cent more work could be done in the year. This standard is used at school—regular attendance and steady, constant work are the only basis on which a child may be promoted. When he comes every day and does each day's work then nothing can keep him from being promoted. Those who do neither of these may expect nothing.
