POLL TAX RECEIPT OR NO VOTE THIS YEAR.

Nothing is so jarring, so disagreeable to the more than average man, than to be reminded of taxes, and taxes due, and to be paid. The sheriff's notice, the tax collector's notice, to come up and pay your taxes, would be unread, if possible, but the tax paying does not pass, it has to be met, or there is trouble and expense.

The State law requiring the payment of every poll tax before May first of each year, or those failing to do so must forfeit their right to vote in the elections of the year, is still in active force At this season the election looks a long way off, while the payment of money is a very present aggravation. But less than sixty days remain for poll tax payment, if the voter is to exercise his franchise this year at elections, and it must not be forgotten that failure to pay before May first, in no way cancels the payment, for it must be paid sometime. The loss is to the voter. He loses his identity at election time.

Tax paying to the general citizen, seems to represent the giving up of money without any particular return. Taxes are always wasted, says the citizen, and I don't see where my money goes. And thus reasoning the citizen dodges the sheriff and tax collector until forced to payment because of some penalty, like the loss of election rights, or the added cost for having his name on the linquent list.

And now it is for the voter who would be one with every right, to pay at once his County and State poll tax, or becollector. What a glorious world this by a trick. would be for sheriffs and all tax collectors, if tax payers would rush forward early in each year, and pay all their taxes! But such an ideal world is not for present or future generations. The growling tax payer is to be always a feature of each generation, while sheriffs and tax collectors are to be ever hunters of the fleeing man, who puts off until the last from his tax pay-

There is no doubt that different kinds of food might make some difference in the number of feeds required in a day for the light preservation of the cow's culiar to their sex, while jin reality the health and the greatest production of W. igested more quickly than others and sess less nutritive qualities and refere should be fed oftener for the comfort of the cow and the most profit of the dalryman. Some cows have stronger digestive owers than others, and consequen eir stomachs have done their

and are ready to receive another meal coner. Green, tender grass, roots, sumpkins and apples will be digested poner than hay, corn fodder and grain. A cow of vigorous digestion, fed on food that is easily digested and not overstrong in nourishment, might get ungry oftener and do better on three meals a day, but the generality of cows fed on dry feed, hay, cornstalks, slage, rument and bran are, according to my experience, less dainty and par-ticular about their food, eat it with a relater relish and do better in the long un with but two feeds per day.

No animal was ever intended to sub-sist alone on dry, concentrated foods, writes an Illinois farmer in American arites an Illinois farmer in American Agriculturiat. What the hog needs along with concentrated foods is an occasional succeivent ration, with the apportunity to provide him with clover, mpe, beets, articholous, sluge, etc. There is no reason why he should be alundoned to the conditions which invite diseases and death.

There is not a month of the year when an occasional succeivent ration could not be provided for the hog. This with pure water would could him to resist and throw off the germs and discount always prevalent and sufficiently frequent to till when subjected to conditions inviting death,

Facts About Fires.

An insurance journal in contemptuous terms has been setting before us our rank idiocy in burning up millions of dollars of valuable property and killing off thousands of persons. In 1904 70 fewer than 7,000 lost their lives by tire, which is an average of nineteen lives a day. The increase in deaths has been growing regularly, our present ratio being about nine lives out of every 100,000 of the population lost by fire every year. In 1900 the fatio was eight and in 1900 it was but five. New Yor : averages 8,700 fires a year, Chi-engo 4,160. We burn up three cheaters, three public halls, twelve churches, tenschools, two hospitals, two asylums, two colleges, six apartment houses, three department stores, two falls, twenty-six hotels, 140 flat houses and nearly 1,000 homes every week of the year. Not even China and Japan, with their paper and bamboo houses, submit to such a fire tax as we do. Our fire leases are equal to a tax of \$25 per year for every family, and that tax shows but the value of the property actually consumed, not the additional quantity damaged by water or smoke \$1,000,000,000 worth in six years. The showing is creditable neither to our in telligence nor our thrift.—Vogue.



Applying Gold Paint to Wood. In applying gold paint to wood much lepends on the medium employed in the preparation of the paint, A simple method is to rub the surface down with No. 0 sandpaper, dust well and then give the work a coat of chrome paint prepared by mixing middle chrome paste paint with boiled oil, four parts; oak warnish, two parts, and turpentine, one part. This should be applied thinly and evenly and allowed to dry hard. Should any brush marks show rub emooth with the sandoaper dust again and then apply prepared gold paint with a soft brush. The color of the chrome forms an excellent ground for the gold paint.

New Idea For Washboards. The inventor of the washboard here with shown claims that it has a sur face which will enable clothes to be

rapidly and thoroughly washed without fujuring the fabrics and without tearing away the buttons. In the sides of the frame are bearings into which a number of rollers are journaled. 
