WAKE REPUBLICANS

Declare For State Prohibition. Two Cent Railroad Fares and Spencer Adams

Raleigh, June 23.—At the Wake County Republican Convention held today a resolution was adopted declaring that State Convention's platform ought to have a pledge to submit to the voters next year, the question of prohibition, and pledging the legislature to enact a law requiring that first class fare on railways shall not exceed 2 cents per mile.

Spencer Adams was endorsed for State chairman, only one delegate declining to serve on the delegation, thus instructed for Adams, saying he was sorry could not be on and address the convention, and declaring that good men all over the State were writing him they were tired of the Democratic party.
