The net earnings for the last three months of the corporation's year were \$32,553,956. The figures exceeded the hopes of the steel trade. The net earnings for the year 1907 were \$160,-984,477, the largest in the company's history. The unfilled orders on hand at the end of the year amounted to 4.031,753 tons. The surplus for the quarter was \$3,559,247. The usual quarterly dividends of 1-2 per cent, on the common and 13-4 per cent. on the preferred stocks were declared by the directors.

The net earnings for the last three months of 1907 show a decrease of \$9,180,969, as compared with the same period of 1906, and the unfilled orders on hand are 3.865,165 tons under the figures for the corresponding quarter last year
