Torpedo Boat Goggles.
On account of the high speed attained by the new torpedo boat destroyer the Flusser a somewhat remarkable innovation has been introduced in the equipment of naval officers. It is a far helmet, fitted with goggles, not unlike those used by automobilists. This innovation was found necessary not only on account of the high speed of the Flusser (32 knots per hour), in which the eyes and face are in danger of injury from the cutting wind and hard driven spray, but also as a protection against the sparks from the smokestacks, which are low lying. If the experiment proves satisfactory it is probable that all officers on similar craft will be supplied with these helmets.—New York Herald.
